

Legal Resources

There are many reasons why state employees may need legal services. An estimated 90 percent of the population needs legal assistance at one time or another for things like money issues, buying and/or selling real estate, credit problems, tenant/landlord difficulties, bankruptcy and debt. Other reasons may include family matters such as divorce, child support and custody issues, taking care of senior citizens, powers of attorney, and will preparation. The following agencies and programs can help with legal matters:

- **The State Bar of Michigan** website has several resources available to assist Michigan citizens find an attorney and get information about Michigan laws. It includes links to an online attorney search, Legal Aid programs by county, a legal help website and the Michigan Online Legal Resource Center.
