



State School Aid Act - Section 61a(1)

Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs may be funded through federal, state or local sources. These include federal Carl D. Perkins funds ([Perkins V](#)), state school aid categorical funds, and local vocational millage funds, as well as state foundation grant funds. Funds may be used to coordinate, implement, and improve CTE state-approved programs to meet the needs identified in the region.

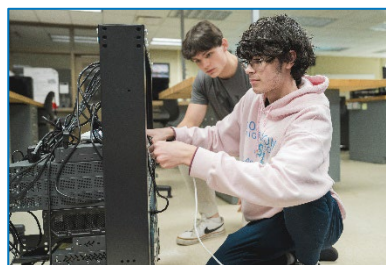


State School Aid Section 61a(1) Funds

The State Legislature has appropriated categorical funds under Section 61 in the State School Aid Act for support of secondary CTE programs including Section 61a(1).

The purpose of Section 61a(1) funds is to provide partial reimbursement to school districts and area centers for the extra costs associated with the operation of state-approved CTE programs (above the cost of non-CTE courses).

Section 61a(1) funds are calculated based on a funding formula that takes into account the State Rank List (job openings, placements, and wages). The formula is also based on student enrollment and advancement in CTE programs and program cost. See [Section 61a1 Added Cost Guide](#) for additional information.
