### Child Nutrition Programs (CNP) Bulletin No. 3 - Public Notification for Waiver Request - July 30, 2025

---

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) will request permission to waive certain rules for CNP. The request follows federal guidelines.

MDE is asking for this waiver on behalf of approved National School Breakfast and Lunch Program sponsors, Summer Food Service Program sponsors, and Child and Adult Care Food Program sponsors in Michigan. The goal is to let these sponsors continue providing meals during unexpected events that stop normal school operations. Those events could include things like natural disasters, major building repairs, safety issues, strikes, or similar emergencies - regardless of whether schools switch to online learning.

If approved, the waiver would last until June 30, 2026.
