Child Nutrition Programs (CNP) Bulletin No. 9 - Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP) Expected Awards - September 9, 2025

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is pleased to announce the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP) expected awardees for the upcoming 2026 Fiscal Year (FY). The new **FFVP Expected Grant Award List** is available on the [MDE FFVP How to Apply website](#). Expected grantees will be contacted via email with additional information and upcoming training options. Schools that were not selected this year are encouraged to apply next year.

For the FFVP, the 2026 fiscal year runs from October 1, 2025 – September 30, 2026. Right now, the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) has not yet given FFVP funds for this period to the MDE Office of Nutrition Services (ONS). Because of this, schools that received the FFVP grants for FY 2026 are encouraged to start serving fresh fruit and vegetable snacks in October. However, they cannot request or be reimbursed for any costs until USDA sends the funds to MDE, and MDE makes them available in NexSys. Grantees will get an email once the funds are ready, along with instructions on what to do next.
