Child Nutrition Programs (CNP) Bulletin No. 17 - M.C.I. Foods, Inc. Recall - October 20, 2025

The Michigan Department of Education Office of Nutrition Services wants to let you know about a food recall that may impact you. M.C.I. Foods Inc. is recalling approximately 91,585 pounds of specific lots of ready-to-eat breakfast burrito and wrap products containing eggs that may be adulterated with *Listeria monocytogenes*.

These are individually and bulk packaged frozen breakfast burritos and wraps that were produced between September 17, and October 14, 2025. A list of the products subject to recall can be found here: [view product list](#). The labels for the impacted products can be found here: [view labels](#).

The United States Department of Agriculture Food Safety and Inspection Service is concerned that some products may be in institutional refrigerators or freezers. Institutions are urged not to serve these products. These products should be thrown away.

There have been no confirmed reports of illness due to consumption of these products. Anyone concerned about illness should contact a healthcare provider.
