Child Nutrition Programs (CNP) Bulletin No. 55 - Outbreak Investigation of Potential Salmonella Contamination: Tomatoes - May 13, 2025

Due to the popularity of tomatoes in Child Nutrition Programs, the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) Office of Nutrition Services (ONS) wants to bring extra attention to the following food recall:

Ray & Mascari Inc. of Indianapolis, Indiana, is recalling four count Vine Ripe Tomatoes packaged in clam shell containers because of the potential for them to be contaminated with Salmonella. No illnesses have been reported to date.

The recalled tomatoes were sold by Gordon Food Service Stores in Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Missouri, Mississippi, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, and Wisconsin.

- 20 oz. (1 lb. 4 oz) package with UPC# 7 96553 20062 1
- master case label Lot# RM250424 15250B or Lot# RM250427 15250B
