Child Nutrition Programs (CNP) Bulletin No. 61 - Cucumber Recall - June 9, 2025

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) Office of Nutrition Services (ONS) wants to let you know about a cucumber recall.

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and Center for Disease Control (CDC) are investigating an outbreak of Salmonella infections linked to Bedner Growers Inc. Two cases of illness have been reported in Michigan. For current updates, visit the [FDA website](#).

The recalled cucumbers were sold at Bedner's Farm Fresh Market in three Florida locations between April 29, 2025, and May 14, 2025. The recalled cucumbers were also sold to its wholesale distributor. The FDA knows that these cucumbers were available at food service operations and retail locations and is working to find all locations where these cucumbers were sold. Some Michigan businesses that used or repackaged these cucumbers, like Kroger and Restaurant Depot, are also issuing recall notices ([recall notices from the companies](#)).

Salmonella illness usually occurs within 12 to 72 hours after eating contaminated food. The symptoms, including diarrhea, fever, and stomach cramps, usually last four to seven days. Young children, older people, and people with health issues are more likely to get sick. Anyone feeling sick after eating recalled cucumbers should call their doctor.
