

## Child and Adult Care Food Program in Michigan

The Child and Adult care Food Program (CACFP), like the School Lunch and Breakfast Program, is a federally funded entitlement program designed to assist day care centers, Head Start, outside school-hour programs, and family and group day care homes to provide low cost, nutritious meals and snacks for children and adults in care. The program was expanded during Fiscal Year 1999 to include emergency shelters serving homeless children and adult meal reimbursement during Fiscal Year 2013.

*\* Public school K-12 enrollment is typically collected from the October school meals claim submission. Many schools were utilizing the COVID-19 Child Nutrition Waivers to operate the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) in October 2020 in place of the traditional school meal programs. Enrollment is not included in the SFSP meals claim. Therefore, the FY 2021 enrollment is instead from the MSDS General Collection that took place in Fall 2020.*
