Child and Adult Care Food Program in Michigan

The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), like the School Lunch and Breakfast Program, is a federally funded entitlement program designed to assist day care centers, Head Start, outside school-hour programs, and family and group day care homes to provide low cost, nutritious meals and snacks for children and adults in care. The program was expanded during Fiscal Year 1999 to include emergency shelters serving homeless children and adult meal reimbursement during Fiscal Year 2013.
