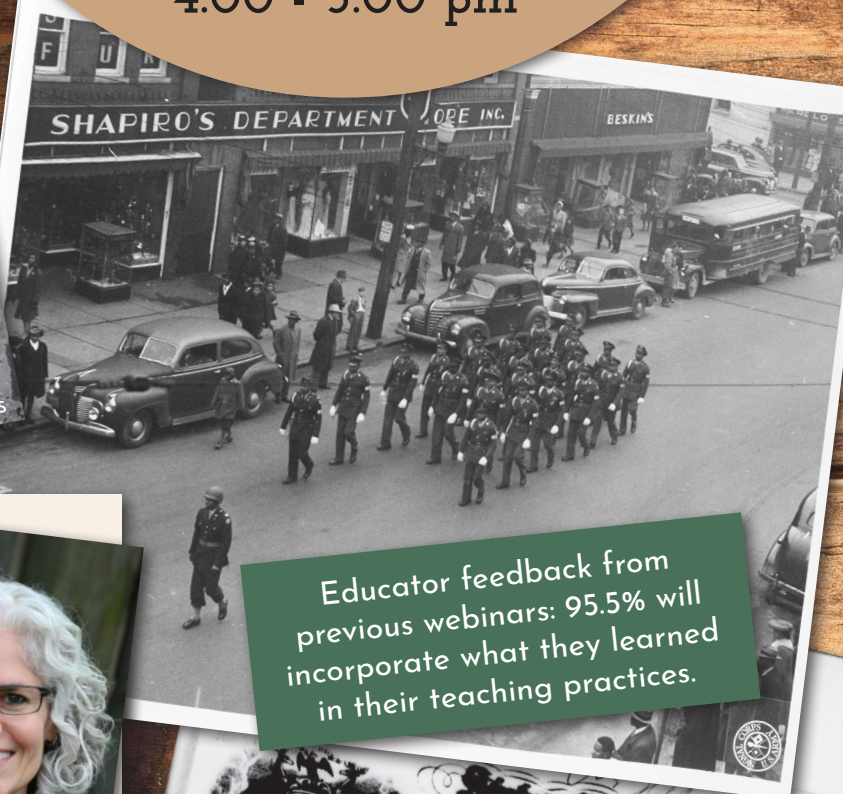
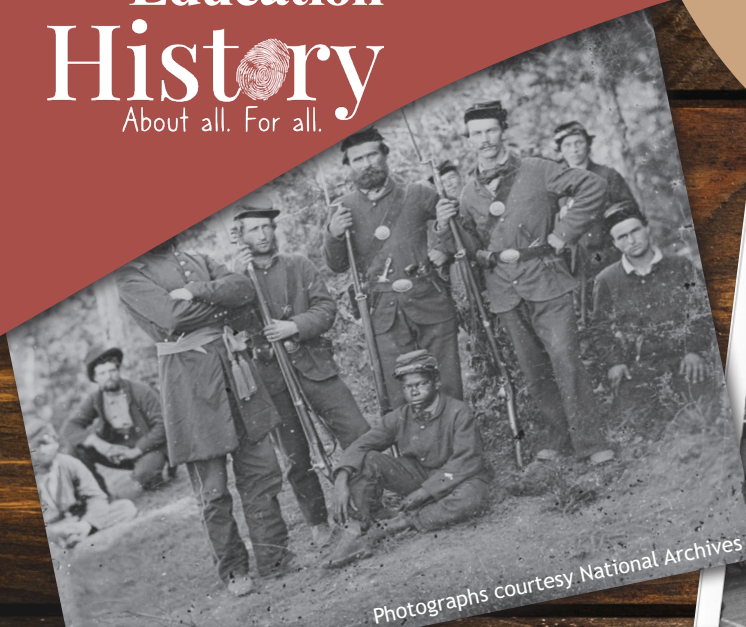

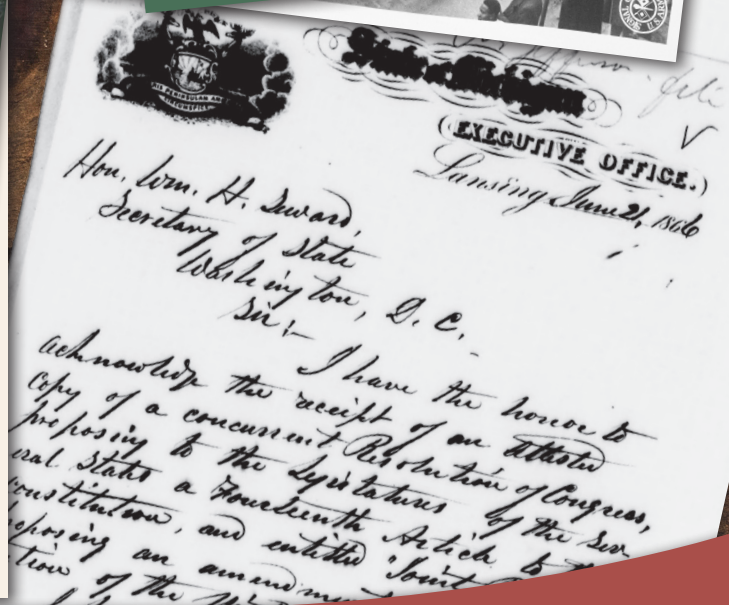
Featuring

Dr. Brandwein is a specialist in law and politics, including race and civil rights. Her research provides learning opportunities about race and labor that shaped struggles to end slavery, the ratification of the 13th, 14th, and 15th amendments to the U.S. Constitution, and Reconstruction.



Each unique session in this webinar series will focus on the history of the Civil War Amendments up to the Civil Rights Movement. Dr. Brandwein will discuss the U.S. South as a slave society, the Reconstruction Era, and the Jim Crow Era. Information includes the formation of political parties, acts, compromises, economic policies, and court decisions that influenced this time period.
