<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the only federal funding source dedicated exclusively to supporting local afterschool, before-school and summer learning programs</li> <li>• The program serves nearly 2 million youth, through grants awarded by state education agencies</li> <li>• at least 1/3 of students show improvement in literacy and 45% maintain literacy skills<sup>1</sup></li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• online summer reading activities for grades K-12</li> <li>• access to full-text articles, books, and other research information for free at any time</li> <li>• eResource usage reached 21.3 million<sup>2</sup></li> <li>• MeL.org received almost one million visitors in 2018-2019</li> <li>• A new section devoted to educators had over 8,500 page views per month<sup>2</sup></li> <li>• MeLCAT A statewide interlibrary loan system that makes borrowing between libraries (from the smallest to the largest) possible</li> <li>• Over 47 million items available, with a request fill rate of 90.9%</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A program in which public librarians model early literacy skill development directly to families, early childhood centers, classrooms, and daycares.</li> <li>• 649 public libraries received Ready to Read programming kits for outreach and library use<sup>2</sup></li> <li>• Over 15,000 children were reported attending Ready to Read Michigan events<sup>2</sup></li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Summer Reading program at public libraries encourages children, youth and families to read and helps children maintain reading skills</li> <li>• Over 106,000 children, teens, and adults participated from 43% of Michigan libraries<sup>2</sup></li> <li>• Over 240,000 youth, teens, and adults attended one of the 7,481 summer reading program events held at Michigan public libraries</li> </ul>
