The assessment was administered to all students in attendance at the district. In addition, students who were participating in virtual learning were encouraged to participate in the assessment as well, providing an alternate time/location to complete the assessment. A total of 19 students who were participating virtually did NOT participate in the assessment by parent/student choice.

Parents were contacted by telephone and a letter outlining the option to have the students participate in the alternate assessment in an alternate time/location within the window outlined by the state. Precautions were made such as sanitization, wearing masks, individual testing time with the required number of administrators of the assessment.

Please describe other justification:

The Berrien RESA operates two center-based programs that services students with significant disabilities. Blossomland Learning Center has programs for students with moderate and severe cognitive impairments and severe multiple impairments. Lighthouse Education Center has programs for students with emotional impairments and autism spectrum disorder. A high number of students will participate in alternate assessments due to the individual needs of the student and the severity of the disability.
