Attendance was poor when students were learning virtually. Students grades k-3 were asked to test in person at Academy of Warren. Breakfast and snack were provided for all students testing in person. Special education students in higher grades were tested virtually and individually and all accommodations provided. However, the majority of students did not appear to be motivated to give testing their best effort. Many did not show up for testing or fell asleep during it, or guessed on all the answers just to get it over with.

Please describe other justification:

Given that the 2020-2021 school year was almost entirely remote it seemed that the majority of students were dealing with academic and social regression. Further, the school population at Academy of Warren consists of students eligible for free or reduced cost meals. Many come from single parent households. Abuse and neglect are common place and it was clear that last school year was all about survival. Food on the table, roof over their heads, physical safety took priority over testing.

Historically the percentage of students taking MI ACCESS has been at or around 1 percent. For the 2020-2021 school year that percentage changed relative to the overall percentage of students taking the assessment. Special education students showed a better participation rate based on the efforts of resource room teachers to get them in for testing. Further, some technological challenges persisted such as students and teachers losing connection or having to test virtually students in a small group. Testing students during a pandemic year provided for stress and possible human error as the teachers struggled with keeping students engaged, present and motivated.
