The High School students who took alternative assessments for statewide testing have special education eligibility as a student with Cognitive Impairment, and are currently working towards earning their Certificate of Completion. The elementary/middle school age students that took the alternative assessments have eligibility of Other Health Impairment for severe seizure disorder that greatly impacts cognitive functioning, and Autism Spectrum Disorder that also impedes their ability to take the general assessments, even with accommodations. Looking to the future, these students will likely attend a Center-Based Program or work towards Certificate of Completion during their high school years.

Anywhere between 4%-25% of students were out of the district in virtual learning at any one time. This made it difficult to always make changes to their IEPs as some parents were unable to be reached. It also impacted the district's ability to potentially move some students to a general assessment- COVID-19 and the Pandemic impacted students opportunities gain skills at a rate they otherwise would have.

Only those students who were shown to need the Alternate Assessment were listed under that assessment. Additionally, in Science and Social Studies, because there are less students who take those subject area tests, it takes a much smaller number of students to reach the 1% threshold.

The training indicated that these students should be strongly considered to take the general state determined assessment, as they are outperforming the criteria on the alternate assessment. In this consideration, their curriculum should match the assessment they are taking. This would suggest that a placement in a CI program is potentially not their least restrictive environment. As they reviewed student data, they were asked to take special note of the students special education eligibility and the criteria for placement on the alternate assessment provided by MDE.
