Our student population was actually 1347 that should have taken the ELA and Math assessments however, due to covid, families chose to remain virtual and therefore did not have their child come in for the assessments. This would have had us at a participation rate of .9% for ELA and .8% for math, even with our residents from St. Louis Center.

Please describe other justification:

The Chelsea School District has a residential facility, St. Louis Center, within its school boundaries. Students placed there have significant impairments and in order to be eligible for placement must have an IQ of 70 or below. During the 2020/21 school year, 5 residents took MI ACCESS with the Chelsea School District. If these students were not residing at St. Louis Center, our numbers would be 8 students(putting us at a .6% MI ACCESS participation rate) taking the alternate assessment for ELA and 7 students taking it for math(putting us at a .5% MI ACCESS participation rate).


