



## Parental/Guardian Consent Form for the SAT Suite of Assessments

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During a school day, your child will participate in one of the [SAT Suite of Assessments](https://satsuite.collegeboard.org) (https://satsuite.collegeboard.org)—SAT® with Essay, PSAT/NMSQT®, PSAT™ 10, or PSAT™ 8/9. The SAT Suite prepares students for success beyond the classroom and provides important insights that track student progress over time. Assessments in the SAT Suite include:

- [SAT with Essay](https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/sat/sat-school-day) (https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/sat/sat-school-day): This assessment gives your child the opportunity to take the SAT during a regular day at school. It tests the reading, writing, and math that your child is learning in class which research shows matters for college and career.
- [PSAT/NMSQT](https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/psat-nmsqt) (https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/psat-nmsqt): The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test is great practice for the SAT. This assessment provides access to personalized recommendations about AP (Advanced Placement) course options, connects students to scholarship opportunities, and helps students to explore their career options. Students who meet program entry requirements will be eligible for the [National Merit® Scholarship Program](https://www.nationalmerit.org/s/1758/interior.aspx) (https://www.nationalmerit.org/s/1758/interior.aspx), an academic competition for recognition and scholarships conducted by National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC).
- [PSAT 10](https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/psat-10) (https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/psat-10): Designed for grade 10 students and administered in the spring, this assessment provides your child with a check on their academic progress and enables them to qualify for the [National Recognition Programs](https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/communities-events/national-recognition-programs) (https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/communities-events/national-recognition-programs).
- [PSAT 8/9](https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/psat-8-9) (https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/psat-8-9): Designed for grade 8 and grade 9 students, this assessment helps your child to understand where they are and where they want to go with regard to college and career readiness, to find what AP courses they're ready to take, and to explore college and career options.

Score reports are provided to your child's school. Additionally, students may access their test scores on [College Board's BigFuture School™](https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/digital/educators/in-school-testing/introducing-bigfuture-school) (https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/digital/educators/in-school-testing/introducing-bigfuture-school) mobile application. (Note: This app is not available for PSAT 8/9 test results or for students less than 13 years old.) Students can download BigFuture School from an app store and then use the phone number they provided during testing to authenticate into the app, where they can see their scores and get customized career information and guidance about planning and paying for college. The phone number that the student provides during testing is used only for app authentication and to notify your child by text that test scores are ready.

During testing and while they're using the BigFuture School™ app, students can also choose to opt in to Connections™. This new program, which is free to students, connects students to nonprofit colleges, scholarship organizations, and nonprofit educational organizations interested in students like them, without disclosing any of your child's personal information.

- In BigFuture School, your child will see messages sent on behalf of these college/scholarship organizations, who at no point will know your child's identity. These messages can also be sent to the student through their email and postal mail, if the student has provided these addresses during testing. If a student is interested in one of the colleges or programs, the student decides if and when to contact them.
- Through Connections, colleges and programs tell College Board whom they are looking for, and College Board matches those requests to students who opt into Connections, based on both information the student and their school provided during testing and the student's test scores.
- Students can control specific communication preferences and further personalize their experiences in Connections and may opt out of the program at any time.

During testing, your child may choose to provide basic information about themselves, which may be used to administer the test and to maintain the fairness and validity of the test. This information may also be used, on a de-identified basis, for psychometric and educational research purposes as well as to maintain, to develop, to support, to improve, and to diagnosis College Board's services and applications. If your child chooses to access the optional BigFuture School mobile app or to participate in Connections, this information is also used to customize their experiences in the app.
