

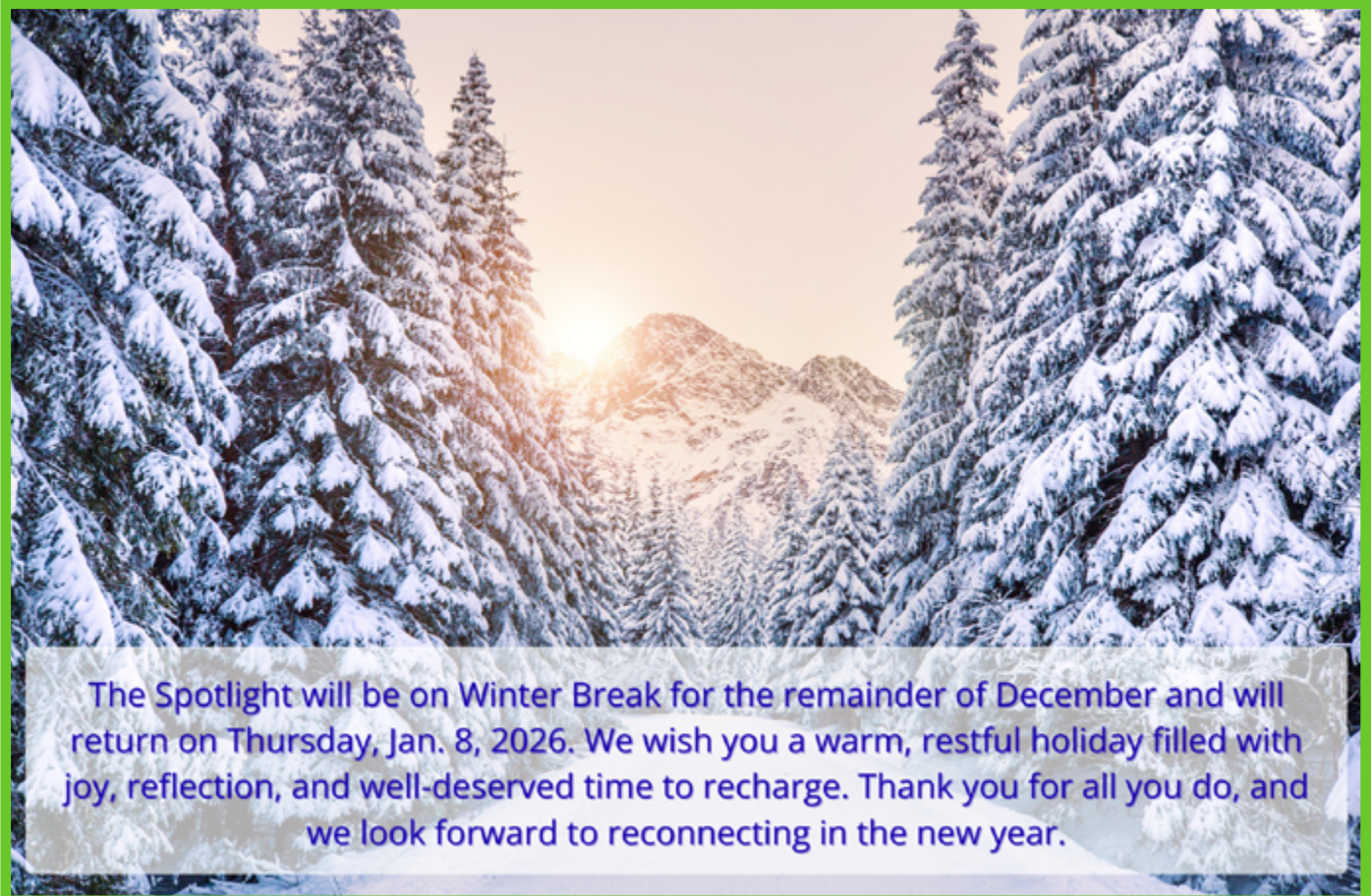

Benchmark Data Submission Deadline and Opening of the Reporting and Funding Application

The Fall Benchmark Data Submission deadline is tomorrow, Friday, December 19, 2025.

Fall benchmark assessment results and Mode of Instruction data must be received by the Michigan Data Hub no



later than **Friday, December 19, 2025**. This applies to districts administering one or more of the following benchmark assessments:

- Curriculum Associates i-Ready
- Data Recognition Corporation (DRC) provided Smarter Balanced Interim Assessments
- DRC-provided Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments
- NWEA Map
- Renaissance Star

NexSys Benchmark Reporting and Funding Application opening on January 5, 2026

The 2025-26 NexSys Benchmark Reporting and Funding application will open on **January 5, 2026** and will remain open through **January 30, 2026**.

In addition to meeting the December 19 data reporting deadline, schools seeking funding must complete this application no later than January 30, 2026. The Michigan Department of Education requests all districts complete the NexSys application to ensure the most complete legislatively required benchmark report can be produced.

Districts may use the NexSys to report on benchmark assessments and to apply for funding. The current application is similar to last year's application with one major change: applicants are now to complete preliminary budgets with estimated allocations. Successful applicants will be asked to modify and finalize their budgets with awarded amounts.

Alternate INSIGHT Availability Request Form Opening Soon for M-STEP and MI-Access

The M-STEP and MI-Access online testing engine, INSIGHT, is available from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on school days during the test administration windows. However, some schools have regularly scheduled instructional hours outside of this time-frame and may need access to INSIGHT earlier in the morning or later in the evening.

To request alternate testing hours availability, assessment coordinators must complete the [Alternate INSIGHT Availability Request Form](https://forms.office.com/g/53vDaenS8y) (https://forms.office.com/g/53vDaenS8y) for the individual testing locations.

The form is also available on both the [M-STEP web page](http://www.michigan.gov/mstep) (www.michigan.gov/mstep) and [MI-Access web page](http://www.michigan.gov/mi-access) (www.michigan.gov/mi-access), under the **What's New** and **Current Assessment Administration** sections.

INSIGHT availability will be scheduled based on the entity information provided in each request form to ensure appropriate access during the preferred testing times.

Requests must be submitted between **January 5 through the close of business on March 13, 2026**. We encourage coordinators to submit their request forms as early as possible to ensure INSIGHT access during their preferred testing times.

Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments Winter 2026 Test Window

The Winter 2026 Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments testing window will be open **January 5 to February 6, 2026**. Students in grades K-2 who tested in Fall 2025 have been automatically pre-identified to the Winter 2026 Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessment by the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA).

1. Students who tested in Fall 2025 and will test in Winter 2026 are pre-identified and will be pulled into the DRC INSIGHT Portal to be assigned to test sessions.
2. No action is necessary for students who tested in the Fall 2025 administration but will not test in the Winter 2026 administration. While students will appear in the DRC INSIGHT Portal because they were automatically pre-identified for Winter 2026 testing, there is no requirement to assign them to test sessions in the DRC INSIGHT Portal.
 - a. **Note:** Some schools choose to create a "Not Testing" test session and move students into that session so they are not included in the test sessions.
 - b. If the entire school not testing any students for Winter 2026 Early Literacy Benchmark assessments, no action is necessary.
3. Students who did not test in the Fall 2025 administration must be pre-identified in the [OEAA Secure Site](http://www.michigan.gov/oeea-secure) (www.michigan.gov/oeea-secure) for testing in Winter 2026.

2025-26 Annual Education Report Preview Available

Embargoed 2025-26 Annual Education Reports (AERs) are now available to authorized MI School Data users at www.mischooldata.org. To review AERs, authorized individuals will need to login to [MI School Data](http://www.mischooldata.org) (www.mischooldata.org). Once logged in, authorized users can access AERs by navigating to the **K-12 Grade** menu, selecting the **School Accountability** submenu and then clicking **Annual Education Report**. The preview window will end on **January 12, 2026** when AERs will be made publicly available.

AERs contain detailed data on accountability results, state-provided student assessment results, educator qualification information, state results for the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), and more. AERs generated from MI School Data are prepopulated with required information for the state, each local education agency (LEA), and each school.

After AERs become publicly available, districts and schools are required post to the district website and disseminate to parents and communities by February 20, 2026.

Spring SAT Suite Pre-ID Window

The Michigan Department of Education's (MDE) student Pre-Identification (Pre-ID) window for Spring SAT Suite testing is January 5 – February 13, 2026. Students' Pre-ID is conducted in MDE's Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) [Secure Site](http://www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure).

Pre-ID for late-arriving students and for other unforeseen changes in student enrollment can be completed from February 16 to April 27 for standard online testers, and from February 16 to April 23 for paper/pencil testers, as well as for any online testers approved for multi-day testing.

College Board will pull Pre-ID data daily from the OEAA Secure Site beginning on February 18 through April 28 for digital testers, and from February 18 through April 24 for paper/pencil testers.

Student registrations will appear in College Board's State Data Management System (SDMS) one business day after any change in OEAA registration data, and in the Test Day Toolkit (TDTK) after two business days.

Access to College Board's State Data Management System and Test Day Toolkit

- Week of February 2: School test coordinators will receive access to Test Day Toolkit
- February 19: District test coordinators, school test coordinators, and Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Coordinators will gain access to SDMS.

SDMS and TDTK are systems used by College Board to enroll students in spring school day testing and to provide access to student tests in Bluebook.

College Board receives Pre-ID data from the OEAA Secure Site to register students in the SDMS. Schools will use students who are registered in SDMS to populate students testing in TDTK. Once students are populated in TDTK, student test tickets will be available in the TDTK Roster (available beginning February 20, 2026) and tests are generated in Bluebook.

Data from SDMS also integrates with accommodations from SSD Online (Services for Students with Disabilities). Approved accommodations in SSD Online are viewable in the student record in SDMS.

Test staff will be notified via email about their access to each application. Educators can also access these systems from their College Board educator account.

Public comment on the revised MI-Access alternate content expectations for social studies is open online through **Friday, December 19, 2025**.
