REMINDER: 2022-23 Sending Scores Back Program for Shared Educational Entities (SEEs and S2E2s) — Application Deadline is January 30

Intermediate School Districts (ISDs), consortia, or other partnering districts may wish to apply to participate in the "Sending Scores Back" Program for school accountability reporting. Eligible schools and classroom programs provide alternative education, early/middle college education, gifted and talented education, or special education services to neighboring or consortium districts.

The Sending Scores Back Program allows non-resident student assessment results and non-resident student graduation statuses to be redirected in school accountability reporting to another school in a student's own district of residency. **Please note:** Public school academies (PSAs) are not eligible for this program as PSAs do not have resident district boundaries in the same way traditional districts do.

Applying for the Sending Scores Back Program will designate your school building or classroom program as a Shared Educational Entity (SEE) or Specialized Shared Educational Entity (S2E2). That status is then used during submissions in the Michigan Student Data System (MSDS) to identify students to be processed specially in school accountability reporting. Students identified in these schools/programs are then attributed back to a school building identified in their resident school district for the purposes of school accountability calculations.

Ordering WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs Materials

Educators can still pre-identify students and obtain materials for the WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs assessment. To pre-ID students for this assessment, use the directions found on the <u>OEAA Secure Site</u> <u>Training page</u> (www.michigan.gov/securesitetraining) under the **Pre-Identification of Students** section. The student's Tier must be updated to "Tier T".

Note: Pre-identifying students in the OEAA Secure Site will not result in the automatic delivery of materials from the assessment vendor (DRC) at this time. To receive materials, educators must place an **Additional Material Order** in WIDA AMS when the Additional Material Order window opens on **January 30, 2023**.

Bubbling-in Student Information on WIDA Test Booklets

Districts and educators are reminded that even if a Pre-ID label is affixed to the student test booklet, some information must be bubbled-in by hand. If a student's pre-printed label is damaged or falls off and the minimum amount of information is not bubbled-in on the booklet, there is a risk that DRC and the Michigan Department of Education will be unable to match a test booklet to the particular student.

The Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) also provides Test Coordinators with a number of resources to help them and their colleagues stay organized. These resources can aid in important conversations about what students need; in assigning Universal Tools, Designated Supports, and Accommodations correctly into systems; and helping educators verify Test Tickets. Writing Skills Field Test

Preparation for Passage-based Writing

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is looking for schools to participate in an M-STEP online Passage-based Writing Field Test **January 3–February 10, 2023**.

Why have a stand-alone field test?

Field tests are used to check the adequacy of testing procedures and statistical characteristics of new test items by testing them in the field before they appear on an actual assessment. This test follows the same setup and security as the M-STEP. The field test helps to ensure that the items we are putting on the M-STEP are high quality. And, the more writing exposure your students receive, the more improvement you will see!

Who can participate?

Students in grades 3-8 can participate in field-testing items written by Michigan authors for Michigan's state assessments.

What is involved?

During the field test, students will read one passage, either literary or informational, from a variety of genres as prescribed by the standards. Students will then answer five multiple choice questions and respond to a writing prompt, which includes a checklist of components found in a well-written essay. They will not receive a score, but will have an opportunity to prepare for the M-STEP and use the checklist to improve their writing skills in the testing environment.

Where will it take place?

The online field test will take place in your school on computers.

REMINDERS

State-Allowed Accommodations and English Learner Supports Window

Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Coordinators can now submit requests for stateallowed accommodations (SAAs) and English learner (EL) time and one-half (+50% extended time) support in SSD Online, through **February 21, 2023**.

If you have already requested extended time for your English learners for Fall 2022 testing, you do not need to re-enter those requests for Spring 2023 testing; the request is good for the academic year. However, if a student used an SAA for Spring 2022 testing, the SSD Coordinator must request the SAA again or request a College Board-approved accommodation for Spring 2023 testing.

Verify School Establishment

To verify if your school is established to participate in the Spring 2023 assessments, check the <u>Test</u> <u>Center Participation Page of the Office of Educational</u> <u>Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) Secure Site</u> (https://www.michigan.gov/mde/services/studentassessment/secure-site-training). Contact <u>College</u> <u>Board</u> (michiganadministratorsupport@collegeboard. org) if establishment is not accurate in the <u>OEAA</u> <u>Secure Site</u> (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure).

Pre-ID in the OEAA Secure Site

All students taking the SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 must be pre-identified in the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) <u>Secure Site</u> (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) **by 5:00 p.m. on February 15, 2023**. The Pre-ID process creates the initial order for pre-printed ID labels for each student identified by this deadline.

Completing ACT's Manage Participation Process

The window for completing Managing Participation is **past due**. If your school(s) has not yet completed Manage Participation using the <u>PearsonAccess</u>^{next} <u>website</u> (https://testadmin.act.org), do so as soon as possible.

This process takes approximately five minutes, and step-by-step instructions are provided in the <u>ACT WorkKeys Spring 2023 Manage Participation</u> <u>Guide</u> (https://www.michigan.gov/mde/-/media/ Project/Websites/mde/OEAA/MME/ACT_WorkKeys_ Manage_Participation_Guide_-_Michigan.pdf) located on the <u>MME web page</u> (www.michigan.gov/ mme).

The names of the schools that will be participating are sent to the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) Secure Site daily. District and Building Assessment Coordinators can verify each school's status by reviewing the Test Center Participation page on the <u>OEAA Secure Site</u> (www. michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) under the **Assessment Registration** drop-down menu.

District Assessment Coordinators should ensure that all high schools in the district have completed the Manage Participation process, even if they are not testing.

Pre-identify Students and Order WorkKeys Test Materials

The window to submit student data for pre-identification barcode labels and to order ACT WorkKeys standard-time and accommodations materials is **January 4 – February 15, 2023**, 5:00 p.m., using the <u>OEAA Secure Site</u> (www.michigan. gov/oeaa-secure).

Instructions for these activities can be found at the <u>Secure Site Training web page</u> (www.michigan.gov/ securesitetraining) under the **Pre-Identification of Students** and the **Material Ordering** sections.

Initial material orders for Standard Time, Regular Print WorkKeys materials will be based on the number of students pre-identified on the OEAA Secure Site **by 5:00 p.m. on February 15, 2023**. Accommodated materials and Spanish test booklets (if needed) must be ordered through the OEAA Secure Site on the **Initial Material Orders** page **by 5:00 p.m. on February 15, 2023**.

The projected number of Standard Time, Regular Print materials that will be sent based on the preidentification can be viewed on the Initial Material Orders page on the OEAA Secure Site. The number of Standard Time, Regular Print materials can only be adjusted by pre-identifying additional students and by unassigning students from the testing. Accommodated and Spanish materials orders will automatically reduce the number of Standard Time booklets.
