Michigan Virtual 2022-23 Assessment Security Modules Are Now Available

The Michigan Department of Education is pleased to announce that this year's 2022-23 Assessment Security Training is now available online through [Michigan Virtual's Professional Learning Portal](https://michiganvirtual.org/course/mde-assessment-security-2022-2023/) (<https://michiganvirtual.org/course/mde-assessment-security-2022-2023/>). The updated training lets users participate in the modules that pertain to their role as Assessment Coordinator and/or Test Administrator.

About the Assessment Security Training course:

- **Module 1:** An Introduction to Assessment Integrity and Security covers why test security is important and discusses planning for testing.
- **Module 2:** Planning for Test Administration covers steps coordinators/administrators need to take before testing begins, such as staff training and preparing the testing environment.
- **Module 3:** Test Administration covers security concerns and considerations during testing.
- **Module 4:** After Test Administration and OEAA Monitoring covers the responsibilities of maintaining assessment security after testing. Material return, incident reporting, and Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability monitoring efforts will be discussed.

Each module is designed to be completed in 10-15 minutes. Learners who complete all four modules and demonstrate their knowledge on the short quizzes at the end of each module will print a Certificate of Completion at the end of the training, to be kept on file within the district or school building.

This course is available free of charge through Michigan Virtual's Professional Learning Portal.

Due to content changes made to the training modules for this year, the Refresher Course is not available, but will return for the 2023-2024 school year.

Annual security training is a requirement for individuals who will take part in the administration of state assessments including ACT WorkKeys, Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark, MI-Access, M-STEP, PSAT 8/9 & 10, SAT with Essay, WIDA ACCESS for ELLs and WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs.

District and Building Assessment Coordinators are required to take the Assessment Security Training course; they are also required to read the [Assessment Integrity Guide \(AIG\)](https://www.michigan.gov/mde/-/media/Project/Websites/mde/OEAA/Assessment-Integrity-and-Security/Assessment_Integrity_Guide) (https://www.michigan.gov/mde/-/media/Project/Websites/mde/OEAA/Assessment-Integrity-and-Security/Assessment_Integrity_Guide).

Test Administrators and Proctors must take the course and/or read the Assessment Security for Test Administrators document related to the assessment being administered, which can be found in the AIG. District and Building Coordinators must determine which training method is best for their testing staff and are responsible for ensuring that the training is delivered.


Other staff with access to secure materials can satisfy the assessment security training requirement by reading the Keeping Assessment Materials Secure instructions found in Appendix E of the [AIG](#).

New Pre-ID Report Enhancements

On February 2, 2023, users of the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) [Secure Site](http://www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) will see a new, enhanced Pre-Identification Report for state assessments. The enhancements were created to help schools identify problems and to ensure students' assessments are not invalidated.

The following changes have been made to the Pre-ID Report:

- It can only be displayed on the page at a test **period** level, not at a test **cycle** level.
 - » The use of Test Period displays helps to ensure that students are pre-identified to all required standard or alternate assessments.
 - » The report totals can be filtered by assessment after the report is run by Test Period by using the "Pre-ID Totals" search criteria at the bottom of the page.
- It can only be displayed on the page at a **school** level, not at a **district** level.
 - » District-level users can download a district report by selecting "District Pre-Id Report" from the school drop-down
- Warnings are displayed (marked by a yellow-highlighted triangle icon ) for the following reasons:
 - » Student is pre-identified to more than one assessment for a content area
 - » Student is pre-identified to MI-Access or WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs (Tier T) but is not identified as special education in the Michigan Student Data System (MSDS)
 - » Student is pre-identified to the WIDA ACCESS or WIDA Alternate ACCESS (Tier T) and is not identified as an English learner in the Michigan Student Data System (MSDS)
- Tabs are displayed to help identify students with issues to be resolved for each of the warnings.
- A tab is displayed to identify students who are not pre-identified to one or more of the required content areas based on grade level.

The Sending Scores Back Program allows non-resident student assessment results and non-resident student graduation statuses to be redirected in school accountability reporting to another school in a student’s own district of residency.

Writing Skills Field Test

Preparation for Passage-based Writing

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is looking for schools to participate in an M-STEP online Passage-based Writing Field Test **January 3–February 10, 2023**.

Why have a stand-alone field test?

Field tests are used to check the adequacy of testing procedures and statistical characteristics of new test items by testing them in the field before they appear on an actual assessment. This test follows the same setup and security as the M-STEP. The field test helps to ensure that the items we are putting on the M-STEP are high quality. And, the more writing exposure your students receive, the more improvement you will see!

Who can participate?

Students in grades 3–8 can participate in field-testing items written by Michigan authors for Michigan's state assessments.

What is involved?

During the field test, students will read one passage, either literary or informational, from a variety of genres as prescribed by the standards. Students will then answer five multiple choice questions and respond to a writing prompt, which includes a checklist of components found in a well-written essay. They will not receive a score, but will have an opportunity to prepare for the M-STEP and use the checklist to improve their writing skills in the testing environment.

Where will it take place?

The online field test will take place in your school on computers.

Michigan Testing Manuals

Michigan-specific testing manuals are now available for the SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 assessments. There are three SAT manuals, one PSAT 10 manual, and one PSAT 8/9 manual. The SAT manuals are posted on the [Michigan Merit Examination web page](http://www.michigan.gov/mme) (www.michigan.gov/mme), and the PSAT-related manuals are posted on the [PSAT web page](http://www.michigan.gov/psat) (www.michigan.gov/psat).

A sample set of manuals will be included in the Coordinator Planning Kit that will be delivered to your school during the week of February 27, 2023. College Board will send the **full** set of manuals for the Spring 2023 testing administration with your pre-administration shipment of materials in mid-March.

Manual	What's Inside
<i>SAT School Day Coordinator Manual</i>	Used by the SAT test coordinator; provides complete instructions for preparing your school and staff for SAT with Essay testing
<i>SAT School Day Standard Testing Manual</i>	Used by the proctor; provides instructions for testing students without accommodations (using purple test books) as well as students with accommodations who are required to test on the primary test day in a standard testing room
<i>SAT School Day Accommodated Testing Manual</i>	Used by the proctor; provides instructions for testing students who are eligible to test in the accommodated testing window (using blue or green test books)
<i>PSAT 10 Coordinator Manual</i>	Used by PSAT 10 test coordinator and proctors for grade 10; provides complete instructions for preparing school and staff for PSAT 10 testing; includes scripts for proctors who will be testing students with or without accommodations
<i>PSAT 8/9 Coordinator Manual</i>	Used by PSAT 8/9 test coordinator and proctors for grades 8 and 9; provides complete instructions for preparing school

REMINDERS

State-Allowed Accommodations and English Learner Supports Window

Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Coordinators can now submit requests for state-allowed accommodations (SAAs) and English learner (EL) time and one-half (+50% extended time) support in SSD Online, through **February 21, 2023**.

If you requested extended time for your English learners for Fall 2022 testing, you do not need to re-enter those requests for Spring 2023 testing; the request is good for the academic year. However, if a student used an SAA for Spring 2022 testing, the SSD Coordinator must request the SAA again or request a College Board-approved accommodation for Spring 2023 testing.

Pre-ID in the OEAA Secure Site

All students taking the SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 must be pre-identified in the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) [Secure Site](https://www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) by **5:00 p.m. on February 15, 2023**. The Pre-ID process creates the initial order for pre-printed ID labels for each student identified by this deadline.
