What's New February 8, 2024

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M-STEP and MI-Access FI Online Sessions

New this year for the online M-STEP and MI-Access FI assessments: Schools will not put students into online sessions on the <u>OEAA Secure</u> <u>Site</u> (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure). Students must still be preidentified by the school for testing on the OEAA Secure Site; then, when the pre-ID records are transferred to the DRC INSIGHT Portal (starting on March 1, 2024), schools will need to put students into sessions for Spring 2024 M-STEP and MI-Access FI.

Detailed directions to create and manage test sessions in the DRC INSIGHT Portal are provided in the <u>DRC INSIGHT Portal</u> <u>User Guide</u> (https://mi.drcedirect.com/Documents/Unsecure/Doc. aspx?id=6896757a-99ca-4e4a-a6f8-592163ba4488). The <u>Creating</u> <u>Test Sessions and Printing Test Tickets</u> mini-module (https://drive. google.com/file/d/1msIFU4FzMHoKMUdVH45XwTv00i-L2HR_/ view?usp=sharing) also provides detailed instructions for creating test sessions.

Note: On page 61 of the <u>M-STEP Test Administration Manual</u> (https:// bit.ly/490GFGe), there is a reference to placing students into test sessions on the OEAA Secure Site. This is no longer accurate. The OEAA is aware of this discrepancy, and an update will be made to the M-STEP Test Administration Manual to remove this reference.

MI-Access Test Administration Manuals Now Available

The Spring 2024 MI-Access Test Administration Manuals (TAMs) are available on the <u>MI-Access web</u> <u>page</u> (www.michigan.gov/mi-access) under the **What's New** and **Current Assessment Administration** sections.

These manuals are essential resources for a successful test administration and contain information about required policies and procedures that test coordinators/administrators must know. All staff involved in the MI-Access administration should download, read, and follow the policies, procedures, and guidelines in the TAMs that are relevant to their role in testing. This will help to ensure a valid, equitable, and trouble-free administration.

WIDA Alternate ACCESS Standard Setting Educator Recruitment

WIDA is seeking educators to participate in the WIDA Alternate ACCESS Standard Setting Study, taking place July 16-19, 2024, in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

During the standard setting event, no more than 64 panelists, including English learner and special education educators, representing every state in the WIDA consortium, will establish proficiency level standards for the WIDA assessments in Listening and Speaking, and Reading and Writing. Panelists will work in four grade cluster groups, with two teams in each cluster.

Panelist Experience and Qualifications

To be considered as panelists, applicants should have experience in teaching or in directly supporting the instruction of English learners (ELs) who have significant cognitive disabilities in kindergarten through 12th grade public schools in the United States or its associated territories.

English Learner educators required experience includes (applicants must meet all criteria as noted):

- greater than two years teaching experience in U.S. public schools
- work with students who have significant cognitive disabilities in the past three years
- · work with ELs in the past three years
- experience working with WIDA's English Language Development standards
- (not required but desired) work with students with a variety of disability types

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Qualifications (applicants must meet at least one criterion):

- · certification in or a certificate as an EL teacher
- certification in or a certificate as an EL program administrator
- certification in or a certificate as a school administrator

Special Education Educators required experience includes (applicants must meet all criteria):

- greater than two years teaching experience in U.S. public schools
- work with students who have significant cognitive disabilities in the past three years
- · work with ELs in the past three years
- experience working with WIDA's ELD standards
- work with students with a variety of disability types

Qualifications (applicants must meet at least one criterion):

- certification in or a certificate as a special educator
- certification in or a certificate as a special education program administrator
- certification in or a certificate as a school administrator

WHAT'S NEW

SSD Accommodation Request Deadline is February 16

The deadline to request College Board-approved accommodations, state-allowed accommodations, and English learner (EL) extended time support in the College Board Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Online system is **February 16, 2024**.

English Learner (EL) Supports

The use of EL supports may not be appropriate for all EL students. To determine if providing EL supports is appropriate, refer to the <u>Supports &</u> <u>Accommodations Guidance Document</u> (https://www. michigan.gov/mde/-/media/Project/Websites/mde/ OEAA/Accommodations-and-Supports/Michigan_ Accommodations_Manualfinal.pdf).

There are three EL supports available to eligible students for the Michigan-provided assessments:

- Time and one-half (+50% extended time) Time and one-half requests must be entered in SSD Online by February 16. These requests do not require documentation and will be automatically approved.
- Translated test directions Requests for the use of translated test directions are not required to be entered in SSD Online. Translated test directions will be available later this month in PDF format for schools to download and print for test day.

The translated test directions provided to students are not Michigan-specific; however, they will provide all relevant directions for students.

The provided directions use only the standard timing script, so test coordinators and proctors must ensure students who are using time and one-half (+50%) pay attention to the timing associated with the test.

 Word-to-word bilingual dictionaries – Requests for the use of word-to-word bilingual dictionaries are not required to be entered in SSD Online.

Screen Reader Request No Longer Requires Documentation Review

College Board has updated its screen reader accommodation request process in SSD Online by removing the documentation review requirement. Michigan Testing Manuals

Michigan-specific testing manuals are now available for the SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 assessments. There are two manuals - one for test coordinators and one for proctors. The Test Coordinator and Proctor manuals are posted on the Michigan MME web page (www.michigan.gov/mme) and Michigan PSAT web page (www.michigan.gov/psat).

School test coordinators are required to read both the Test Coordinator and Proctor manuals. Proctors are required to read the Proctor manual. Links and descriptions for each manual are provided in the table below.

College Board Data Entry Assistance with Test Day Toolkit

Specific to School Test Coordinators:

To facilitate your test day preparations, College Board is offering data-entry assistance for **adding staff and rooms** to Test Day Toolkit (TDTK). Your use of this data-entry assistance is entirely optional. Schools can choose not to participate, if they prefer to set up their own staff and rooms in TDTK.

Here's what to expect:

1. Excel Templates via Email

Watch your inbox for two templates sent from <u>michiganadministratorsupport@collegeboard.org</u> on February 5. One template is for adding test day staff (proctors, room monitors, hall monitors, and technology monitors); the other is for adding rooms. There is no need to include school test coordinators, backup school test coordinators, or district test coordinators in the template for adding staff since College Board will automatically add them to TDTK.

If you prefer, you can also <u>click here to access the</u> <u>templates</u> (https://app.cloud.scorm.com/sc/Invitatio nConfirmEmail?publicInvitationId=f2e65321-1ae6-4ffc-b65b-548f51f5b8b1). Once you enter your first name, last name, email address, and click "Ok, now take me to my training", you will be able to download the files.

Note: If your school tested in Fall 2023, your previous test staff and room information will be preserved in the Test Day Toolkit. If you wish to create a new setup, adding different test staff and rooms, simply submit the completed templates. College Board will replace your old configuration with the updated staff and room details.

2. Smartsheet Submission

Do not send your completed templates as an email attachment. You must submit your completed templates through this <u>Smartsheet</u> <u>link (https://app.smartsheet.com/b/form/</u> ea92af18c43e4cf4a7278f8f5cee3fdc); the link will also be provided in the email you receive from <u>michiganadministratorsupport@collegeboard.</u> <u>org.</u> **Note:** Templates not submitted through the Smartsheet will not be processed.

Important Details:

- **Student Data:** Do not include any student data in the submission of the templates; this data is not needed in this submission.
- Submission Deadline: Ensure the template(s) is/are submitted by February 12, 2024.
 Information submitted will be entered into the Test Day Toolkit by March 1, 2024.

The window to submit student data for preidentification barcode labels and to order ACT WorkKeys standard-time and accommodations materials is **January 3 – February 14, 2024**, **5:00 p.m.**, through the <u>OEAA Secure Site</u> (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure).

Accommodated materials and Spanish test booklets must be ordered (if needed) through the OEAA Secure Site on the Initial Material Orders page by **5:00 p.m. on February 14, 2024**. Order carefully to ensure you receive the correct materials in the correct quantities.

The projected number of Standard Time, Regular Print materials that will be sent based on the preidentification can be viewed on the Initial Material Orders page on the OEAA Secure Site. The number of Standard Time, Regular Print materials can only be adjusted by pre-identifying additional students and/or unassigning students from the testing. Accommodated and Spanish materials orders will automatically reduce the number of Standard Time booklets sent.
