M-STEP Paper/Pencil **Testing Window** ends on Friday, May 3, 2024

Remind Students: Accessing Classroom Materials During Testing is Prohibited

With M-STEP testing underway, the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) has seen a slight increase in reports of students attempting to use instructional materials during testing.



To ensure valid test scores, students must not access any resources that are not explicitly provided by their Test Administrator. Use of any

instructional tools or resources constitutes cheating and requires the student's test to be marked Prohibited Behavior and invalidated.

What can you do?

- · Remind students: Remind students that only resources that are provided by the Test Administrator are allowed to be used during testing.
- Clear testing environment: Ensure student work area is free • of any instructional materials that might tempt students (charts, formula sheets, notes, calculators).
- Monitoring: Keep a watchful eye during testing and provide gentle reminders if you see a student reaching for unauthorized materials.

For future administrations, the OEAA is working on an update to the directions to explicitly remind students they cannot use anything that is not provided by the Test Administrator during testing.

MI-Access Testing Reminders

MI-Access Testing Deadlines

As the testing window proceeds, please remember that all MI-Access assessments, which are only for students with the Most Significant Cognitive Disabilities (MSCD), must be completed with results submitted by **May 24, 2024**.

Students who do not have the Most Significant Cognitive Disabilities, and those who may have recently had their test assignments updated in their Individualized Education Program (IEP) from MI-Access to M-STEP, should complete their M-STEP testing no later than **May 17**.

The majority of students with disabilities will be participating in the M-STEP assessments; those assessments must be completed by:

- Online Test Administration: window ends May 17
- Paper/Pencil Test Administration: window ends May 3 (tomorrow!)

Note: Students who are taking MI-Access for one subject and M-STEP for other subjects will have different deadlines across subjects; test coordinators and test administrators must plan accordingly.

Expressing Ideas Reminder for MI-Access Functional Independence (FI)

The Functional Independence ELA: Expressing Ideas (EI) is a paper/pencil assessment **only**, for both online and paper/pencil testers. The EI answer document must be returned for handscoring in order for students to receive a valid overall English language arts score. Students who are not administered **both** the Expressing Ideas (paper/pencil only) and the Accessing Print and Using Language (online or paper/pencil) will not receive a valid English language arts score.

Social Studies Assessment Reminders for MI-Access Supported Independence (SI) and Participation (P)

State law requires all students take a social studies assessment in grades 5, 8, and 11. The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) does not provide a social studies assessment for students taking the Supported Independence (SI) or Participation (P) levels of MI-Access. Therefore, students in grades 5, 8, and 11 whose IEP indicates the MI-Access SI or P assessment is the most appropriate must take a locally approved/developed social studies assessment. The IEP team must also determine which locally determined social studies assessment will be administered to the student.

In addition, MDE requires districts and/or schools to report the student results of the locally administered social studies tests. Districts/schools will enter the student assessment information on the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability <u>OEAA</u> <u>Secure Site</u> (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) through the Answer Documents Received and Not Tested Students window, which will be open **June 5-11, 2024**.

M-STEP Paper/Pencil Secure Materials Return Deadline: May 8, 2024

All M-STEP paper/pencil secure materials must be returned to the scoring contractor by Wednesday, May 8 to be scored.

Note: All secure test materials still must be returned to the scoring contractor to maintain test material security, even if you miss the May 8 deadline. If your school does not return all secure materials, the district and building coordinators will receive a Missing Materials letter, identifying the missing materials and steps to be taken to return them.

How to Return Secure Materials

A list of the secure materials that must be returned to the scoring contractor, along with detailed instructions for returning them, are found on page 75 of the <u>M-STEP Test Administration Manual (TAM)</u> (https:// www.michigan.gov/mde/-/media/Project/Websites/ mde/OEAA/M-STEP/M-STEP_Test_Administration_ Manual.pdf).

The materials must be returned according to the specific instructions provided in the TAM. Be sure to carefully review the instructions provided on pages 75-80 of the <u>M-STEP TAM</u> (https://www.michigan.gov/mde/-/media/Project/Websites/mde/OEAA/M-STEP/M-STEP_Test_Administration_Manual.pdf) as you prepare materials for return.

Note: Each answer document must have a barcode label attached. Score Release Timeline

For Students

Student score release will be accomplished in two phases based upon when Michigan schools complete their tests. Students whose tests are submitted between April 8 and April 12 can view their scores starting on May 2, while those whose tests are submitted between April 15 and April 26 can view their scores starting on May 16.

Test Submission Dates	Student Score Release
April 8-12, 2024	May 2, 2024
April 15-26, 2024	May 16, 2024

PSAT 10 and SAT with Essay testers can access their scores via the BigFuture School app, if they signed up for the app during Exam Setup. Students aged 13 years or older can access scores through their College Board accounts; students who haven't yet created an account can do so for free at <u>www.</u> <u>collegeboard.org</u>.

Students under 13 must wait until scores are released to educators, who can then print student score reports for distribution.

Matching Student Scores to a College Board Account

If a student is signed into their College Board account but does not see their scores, it may be that College Board was not able to link the student's College Board account and score report automatically. For security reasons, a student must verify additional information before scores can be displayed. Students will need either their SAT registration number (found in the Roster Report of the K-12 Reporting Portal) or the UIC (student ID number) with which they were pre-identified.

To establish a match, the student will:

- Log into their <u>College Board account</u> (https://prod. idp.collegeboard.org/). If the student is aged 13 years or older, they should create an account if one does not already exist for them
- 2. Select the Matching Tool
- 3. Follow the instructions on the screen
- 4. Select one of the following options:
 - I can supply my test information
 - I can supply my student ID (using the UIC)

In some cases, students may not be able to view their scores using the steps above. For instance, if the student has inconsistent information on file, multiple College Board accounts, or unreleased scores, the steps above may not resolve the discrepancy. Returning All Test Materials to ACT

All initial and makeup standard time and accommodations secure test forms must be returned to ACT.

Use the carton(s) in which the test materials were shipped to return all the secure test forms (used and unused). Pack the carton(s) using the instructions and illustration on page 34 of the <u>ACT Test Coordinator</u> <u>Information Manual</u> (https://www.act.org/content/ dam/act/secured/documents/pdfs/state-district-testcoordinator-paper-test.pdf). Any unused cartons may be recycled.

Store the boxes in a secure location within the district or school building until they can be either picked up by FedEx or taken to a local FedEx office.

If your school did not test any students:

- complete the outside of the processing envelope and mark as "Did not test (provide reason)"
- · discard the unused Site Header
- pack all unused initial and makeup secure materials using the instructions below and place the processing envelope on top
- send an email to workkeys@act.org indicating that you did not test any students and provide the reason
