Spring 2022 Student-level Score Reports Available

Reminder: Spring 2022 test results are **embargoed** until the public release of Spring 2022 assessment results later this summer. Districts and schools will be notified through the Spotlight when the embargo has been lifted.

Important: While individual student results may be shared with parents at this time, it is not permissible to share any school-, district-, or state-level results with parents, the community, or other external parties until the embargo is lifted by the Michigan Department of Education. School board meetings are considered open meetings; therefore, the sharing of embargoed assessment results at these meetings is not permissible until the embargo is lifted.


Currently Available Student-level Reports

Student-level reports for the M-STEP, MI-Access, PSAT 8/9 in grade 8, and SAT with Essay Spring 2022 administrations are now available in the Dynamic Score Reporting Site which is accessed through the [OEAA Secure Site](https://baa.state.mi.us/BAASecure) (<https://baa.state.mi.us/BAASecure>).

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To access your school's student-level reports, log into the [OEAA Secure Site](#) and select the **Reports** tab, then select **Dynamic Score Reports** in the drop-down menu. Next, select the Test Cycle, ISD, District, and School for your search criteria. Then, by selecting **Search** you will be directed to the Dynamic Score Reporting Site where you can view your reports.

All reports include an **About this Report** document describing the report and providing examples of appropriate uses. Access the About this Report from the **Take Action** drop-down menu at the top of the screen. Assessment-specific **Interpretive Guide to Reports** manuals will be available before the public release of these reports later this summer.

Printed Parent Reports and Student Record Labels will arrive in schools later in August.

New in 2022

- **MI-Access Science Reports:** MI-Access science assessments have been recently updated to align to the new alternate content expectations. The standard setting process conducted this summer has provided cut scores and overall performance level data; however, science subscore and growth data will not be available for the Spring 2022 test administration.
- **PSAT 8/9 and SAT with Essay Subscores:** Evidenced-Based Reading and Writing and Math subscores are now reported using performance indicators that align with how these scores are reported in the College Board K-12 Reporting Portal:
 - » On Track for College Readiness
 - » Almost on Track for College Readiness
 - » Needs to Strengthen Skills
- **M-STEP Science Subscores:** Science domains are reported using performance indicators, that is, in the same way English language arts and mathematics claims are reported:
 - » **“Above Standard”** indicates the student's performance on the standards that make up the claim or domain is above the overall content standard or proficiency cut.
 - » **“At/Near Standard”** indicates the student's performance on the standards that make up the claim or domain is at or near the overall content standard or proficiency cut.
 - » **“Below Standard”** indicates the student's performance on the standards that make up the claim or domain is below the overall content standard or proficiency cut.

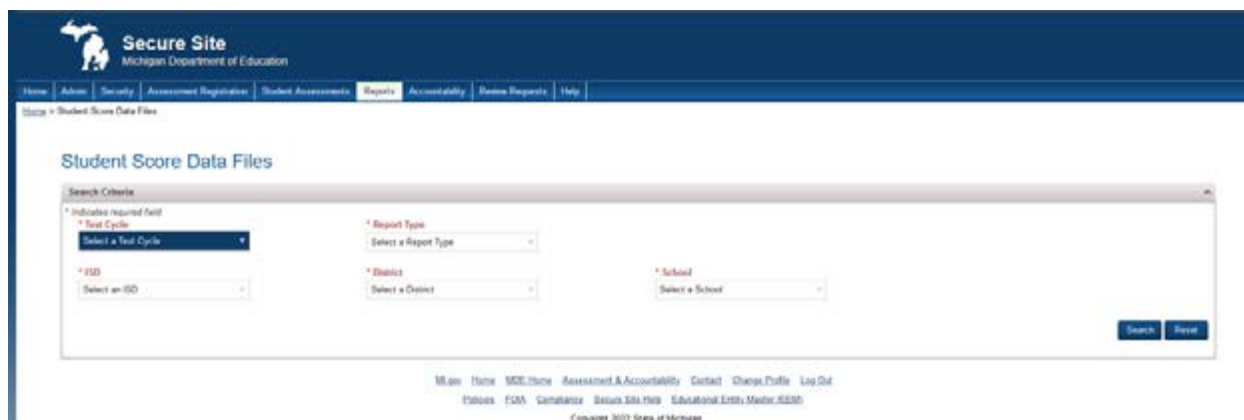
Downloadable student-level data files of the results of the Spring 2022 M-STEP, MI-Access, SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, PSAT 8/9 for Grades 8 and 9, and ACT WorkKeys assessments are now available in the [Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability \(OEAA\) Secure Site](https://baa.state.mi.us/BAASecure) (<https://baa.state.mi.us/BAASecure>).

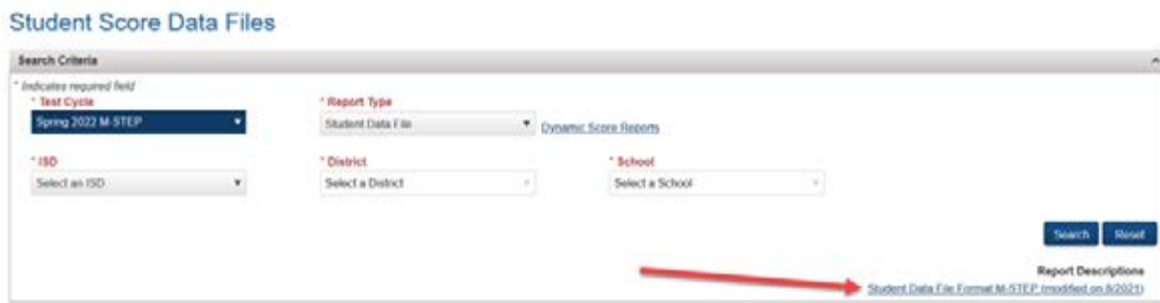

College Board K-12 Reporting Portal May Differ from Student Data Files

Student data has been available in the College Board K-12 Reporting Portal since June 21, 2022. The scores available in the College Board K12 Reporting Portal are not official results used in Michigan Department of Education reporting, so there may be some minor differences between the College Board K-12 Reporting Portal and the downloadable student-level data files from the [OEAA Secure Site](https://baa.state.mi.us/BAASecure) (<https://baa.state.mi.us/BAASecure>) due to invalidation of scores for reasons such as out-of-level testing.

Since final student data is available now, Preliminary Reports are no longer available in the Dynamic Score Reporting Site. Watch the Spotlight for more information about final reports.

Development Opportunity: Michigan Performance Assessment Cadre of Experts (MiPAC) – Cohort III

MiPAC Cohort III Starts September 15; Stipends and SCECHs Available

The Michigan Department of Education and the Michigan Assessment Consortium are looking for education professionals to serve on the Michigan Performance Assessment Cadre of Experts (MiPAC), Cohort III.



MiPAC develops performance assessments aligned to Michigan's model competencies in mathematics and English language arts (ELA) in grades 3-8.

Grades 3-5 mathematics teachers are particularly encouraged to apply.

Working in grade-level teams, MiPAC participants are expected to attend and contribute approximately 50 hours of job-embedded facilitated professional learning and assessment development over the 2022-23 academic year.

Preferred candidates for the Performance Assessment Cadre of Experts:

- have experience in teaching mathematics or ELA in at least one of these grade spans: grades 3-5, grades 6-8
- have experience in teaching to Michigan's mathematics and ELA academic content standards
- are interested in participating in the development of performance assessments

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By participating in this project, educators will have opportunities to:

- learn about the Michigan model competencies for mathematics and ELA
- develop performance assessments and rubrics
- collaborate with colleagues from across the state
- practice calibrating the scoring of performance assessments
- participate in a research agenda that is focused on measuring student competencies through performance assessments
- earn up to 50 SCECH credits; stipends will also be available based on time and completed products

As noted, participants are expected to attend and contribute approximately 50 hours of job embedded facilitated professional learning and assessment development over the 2022-23 academic year. Approximately eight or nine 2-hour virtual after-school sessions to support the design process are expected to be scheduled from September 2022 through June 2023. Participants will work in grade-level teams with colleagues. Team leads will host three or four virtual meetings throughout the year, to keep the item development momentum going and production flowing.

WHAT'S NEW

April 2023 Test Dates

Make sure that students, parents, and staff are aware of the testing dates for the Michigan-provided SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 in Spring 2023. Upcoming Spotlight newsletters will contain information on training, key deadlines, and how to prepare to administer the assessments.

Assessment	Primary Test Date/Window	Makeup Test Date/Window
SAT with Essay	April 12, 2023	April 25, 2023
PSAT 10	April 12-18, 2023	April 25-26, 2023
PSAT 8/9 for Grade 9	April 12-18, 2023	April 25-26, 2023
PSAT 8/9 for Grade 8	April 12, 2023 and April 13-18, 2023	April 25-26, 2023

Important Notes

- The SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 in April 2023 will continue to be administered in the paper/pencil mode.
- The Essay is required for all students taking the SAT.
- Schools must administer the PSAT 8/9 for Grade 8 on April 12, 2023. The primary testing window of April 13-18 is available for students absent on April 12 (unless students are approved with accommodations and will test in the accommodated testing window).
- Schools must administer the PSAT 8/9 for Grade 9 and PSAT 10 on April 12-18, 2023 (unless students are approved with accommodation and will test in the accommodated testing window). Schools must choose one of the dates within the window to serve as the primary test day. The remaining days of the window are available to students absent on the primary test day.

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- The makeup test dates are for students absent during the primary test date for SAT or the entire primary testing window for PSAT 10 or PSAT 8/9. Makeup test dates will also be used for students who experienced a test day issue and need to test again.

Testing Students with Accommodations

- The accommodated testing window is April 12-25, 2023, for the SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9.
- All students testing with accommodations taking the PSAT 10 or PSAT 8/9 may test in the accommodated testing window.
- Only students designated on the Nonstandard Administration Report (NAR) in SSD Online may test in the accommodated testing window for SAT with Essay.



What's New

ACT WorkKeys Score Reports

School- and student-level paper reports will be mailed to test coordinators and are due to arrive in the week of **August 1, 2022**. The shipment will include the following reports:

Individual Summary Score Report — a student-level report containing Level and Scale scores with explanations of what the scores mean. The test coordinators will receive one paper report per student, to be given to the student.

Summary Score Report — a student-level report containing the student's Level and Scale scores but without the explanations of what the scores mean. The test coordinators will receive one paper report per student, to be retained by the school.

Roster Score Report — a roster of students showing test scores and when students took the assessment. The test coordinator will receive one paper report, to be retained by the school.

ACT[®] WorkKeys[®] National Career Readiness Certificate[®] (ACT WorkKeys NCRC)

Students who achieve a minimum score of 3 or higher on each of the three ACT WorkKeys subject tests will earn an ACT WorkKeys National Career Readiness Certificate (or an ACT WorkKeys NCRC en Español if they took the tests in Spanish). The scores on these assessments determine the certification level.

- A minimum score of 3 out of 7 on all three assessments: **Bronze**
- A minimum score of 4 out of 7 on all three assessments: **Silver**
- A minimum score of 5 out of 7 on all three assessments: **Gold**
- A minimum score of 6 out of 7 on all three assessments: **Platinum**

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Student Access to MyWorkKeys.com

Students can view their scores online and print their own National Career Readiness Certificate by creating their free account at myworkkeys.com.

Students will provide the following five matching criteria when creating an account:

- First name
- Last name
- Month of birth
- Day of birth
- State Assigned Student ID Number (SASID)

Note: The SASID is the same number as the Unique Identification Code (UIC) that is assigned through the Michigan Student Data System (MSDS) for each student.

Scores and certificates will be available online indefinitely.

A **Quick Start Guide** is available on the myworkkeys.com login page. The guide contains instructions on creating an account, sharing NCRC information with prospective employers, and other valuable features.
