Embargo Reminder: Spring 2023 test results, except for WIDA ACCESS for ELLs and WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs results, are **embargoed** until the public release of Spring 2023 assessment results later this summer. The end of the embargo will be announced in the Spotlight.

While individual student results may be shared with parents at this time, it is not permissible to share any school-, district-, or state-level results with parents, the community, or other external parties until the embargo is lifted by the Michigan Department of Education. School board meetings are considered open meetings; therefore, the sharing of embargoed assessment results at these meetings is not permissible until the embargo is lifted.

Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments Student-Level Reports Available

Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments Student Level Reports for the Fall 2023 administration are now available in the Dynamic Reporting System through the <u>Office of Educational</u> <u>Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) Secure</u> <u>Site</u> (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure). Reports are available within 48 hours of students completing all portions of a content area test.

To view your school or district reports, go to the OEAA Secure Site (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) and select **Reports**, then **Dynamic Score Reports** in the drop-down menu. For help in accessing and navigating the Dynamic Score Reporting site, refer to the <u>Dynamic Score Reporting User Guide</u> (https://www. michigan.gov/mde/-/media/Project/Websites/mde/ OEAA/General/Dynamic-Score-Reporting-Site-User-Guide.pdf), located under the **Reporting** section on the <u>Early Literacy and Mathematics web page</u> (https:// www.michigan.gov/mde/services/student-assessment/ early-literacy-and-mathematics-benchmarkassessments).

Available reports include:

- Domain Analysis Report Separated by content area, the domain report provides a list of selected students; the report displays a Content Area Scale Score Table and Domain Performance Tables.
- Individual Student Report Separated by content area, the ISR provides detailed information on individual students in the Content Area Scale Score Summary and the Content Area Domain Summary. The Content Area Scale Score Summary gives scale score for the overall content area.
- Student Roster Report Separated by content area, the student roster provides a list of students' Overall Scale Score, Standard Error, Points Earned by assessment category, and domain subtotal.
- Student Trend Report Separated by content area, the trend report provides up to three academic years of scale scores for each assessment that was administered.

Federal Requirement to Identify Potential English Learners

The federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires schools to identify new students who may be eligible to receive English language services within 30 days of enrollment. K-12 Automatic English Learner (EL) Exits

Automatic English Learner (EL) exits have been processed for all kindergarten through grade 12 ELs who met the overall proficiency level target of 4.8 on the 2023 WIDA ACCESS for ELLs or P2 for the 2023 WIDA Alternate ACCESS.

The exits occurred when the students' scores were loaded in the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) Secure Site and after the Michigan Student Data System (MSDS) End-of-Year General Collection was closed out.

REMINDERS

April 2024 Test Dates

In April 2024, the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) administrations of PSAT 8/9, PSAT 10, and SAT with Essay will be delivered digitally. The Spring 2024 testing window for the MDE-provided SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 is April 8-26, 2024.

Schools will have the flexibility to test on any day within the approved window, and they may use multiple days within the window for testing, if preferred. However, students must complete testing in one day unless they have accommodations that allow for two-day testing.

Note: All tests, including accommodated and makeup tests, must be completed between April 8-26. **Students will not be able to complete assessments after April 26.**

School Establishment and the Educational Entity Master (EEM)

School establishment is the process through which Michigan schools are identified as participating in the state assessments and are set up for digital testing in College Board systems.

It is important for schools to update the information in the <u>Educational Entity Master (EEM)</u> (http://www. michigan.gov/eem), which serves as Michigan's repository of education systems and contact information.

College Board will use the data in EEM to identify contact information for testing staff and to establish schools for testing. In addition to test coordinators, backup test coordinators, and Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Coordinators, **building level technology directors must be assigned in EEM** in order for schools to be set up for testing.

For each College Board assessment (SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, & PSAT 8/9 for grades 8 and 9), the following information is required for school test coordinators, backup school test coordinators, SSD Coordinators, and technology directors:

- First Name
- Last Name
- Email
- Telephone Number
- Complete Entity Physical Address (Street Address, City, State, Zip Code)

Note: The mailing address must be the physical district or school address associated with the test coordinator record. Make sure each of the fields above is accurate and complete for all applicable roles. Any incorrect data in EEM could delay your school's establishment process.

Updating EEM

An important first step in preparing for the Spring 2024 ACT WorkKeys assessments is to ensure that your building/school's WorkKeys Test Coordinator's correct contact name, email address, phone number, and mailing address (cannot be a post office box) are listed in the Educational Entity Master (EEM) (www.michigan.gov/eem).

Note: Ensuring that the WorkKeys Test Coordinator contact information is accurate must be done for each school in the district, not just in the district-level information.

ACT uses the information in the EEM to call and send emails to the Workkeys Test Coordinators, and to ship test materials to the appropriate locations. Inaccurate information will result in critical information not being received in a timely manner, resulting in key deadlines being overlooked and delays in the receipt of test materials.

If the information in the EEM for your building/school is inaccurate, contact your authorized district EEM user to update it no later than **Friday, September 8, 2023**, to ensure your school receives the necessary information to start the Manage Participation process in November. **Note:** Updating EEM information can only be done by the district's authorized EEM user. If you are not sure who your authorized EEM user is, use the **District and School Contact page** on the <u>Michigan</u> <u>Department of Education OEAA Secure Site</u> (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) to retrieve their name and contact information.
