#### Data Embargo is Lifted



#### 2023 State Test Scores Improve in Many Grades in Math, Science, Social Studies, and English Language Arts

Test scores for the spring 2023 M-STEP state assessments increased in all tested grades in science and social studies; in six of the seven tested grades in math; and in three grades in English language arts (ELA), the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) reported today.

These data follow the 2022 statewide test results where a majority of Michigan school districts showed improvement over the previous year's results.

"We continue to be encouraged by the gradual improvements in student achievement," said State Superintendent Dr. Michael Rice. "Though the 2022-23 school year was far from normal, given persistent staffing challenges and residual adverse impact of the pandemic, it was the most stable school year of the last four. Michigan's educators worked hard to help students continue to rebound and to increase their learning."

Of the 20 statewide assessments administered to students in Spring 2023, scores increased in 15 of the assessments, decreased in four, and remained the same in one.

## State Assessment Results Available Now in MiLearn

Spring 2023 state assessment results are now available to districts participating in the Michigan Linked Educational Assessment Reporting Network (MiLearn), simultaneous with the public release of the assessment results.

Authorized students, parents, and educators can electronically view the student-level reports of the M-STEP, MI-Access, WIDA ACCESS for ELLs, WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs, and Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmarks assessments.

New this year to MiLearn: PSAT and SAT reports are available, including PSAT for Grades 8/9, PSAT 10, and SAT.

#### What is MiLearn?

The Michigan Linked Educational Assessment Reporting Network (MiLearn) is a Michigan Department of Education (MDE) service that delivers state assessment data electronically to students, parents, and educators directly through the district's Student Information System (SIS). MiLearn is updated daily to reflect student enrollment changes using data from the Michigan Data Hub.

This free service, available to all Michigan school districts, provides a convenient, year-round tool for educators, parents, and students to view multiple years of state assessment reports. MiLearn is convenient since users access the system directly through their SIS without required secondary login information. MiLearn supports the five major SIS vendors: MISTAR-Q, Skyward, PowerSchool, Infinite Campus, and Synergy.

#### How does my district join MiLearn?

#### REMINDERS

#### **April 2023 Test Dates**

In April 2024, the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) administrations of PSAT 8/9, PSAT 10, and SAT with Essay will be delivered digitally. Note: Despite the shift to digital testing, the administration of the SAT assessment will still include the essay section.

The Spring 2024 testing window for the MDEprovided SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 is April 8-26, 2024.

Schools will have the flexibility to test on any day within the approved window, and they may use multiple days within the window for testing, if preferred. However, students must complete testing in one day unless they have accommodations that allow for two-day testing.

**Note:** All tests, including accommodated and makeup tests, must be completed between April 8-26. **Students will not be able to complete assessments after April 26**.

#### School Establishment and the Educational Entity Master (EEM)

School establishment is the process through which Michigan schools are identified as participating in the state assessments and are set up for digital testing in College Board systems.

It is important for schools to update the information in the <u>Educational Entity Master (EEM)</u> (http://www. michigan.gov/eem), which serves as Michigan's repository of education systems and contact information.

College Board will use the data in EEM to identify contact information for testing staff and to establish schools for testing. In addition to test coordinators, backup test coordinators, and Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Coordinators, **building level technology directors must be assigned in EEM** in order for schools to be set up for testing.

For each College Board assessment (SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, & PSAT 8/9 for grades 8 and 9), the following information is required for school test coordinators, backup school test coordinators, SSD Coordinators, and technology directors:

- First Name
- Last Name
- Email
- Telephone Number
- Complete Entity Physical Address (Street Address, City, State, Zip Code)

**Note:** The mailing address must be the physical district or school address associated with the test coordinator record. Make sure each of the fields above is accurate and complete for all applicable roles. Any incorrect data in EEM could delay your school's establishment process.

### Reminder

#### **Updating EEM**

An important first step in preparing for the Spring 2024 ACT WorkKeys assessments is to ensure that your building/school's WorkKeys Test Coordinator's correct contact name, email address, phone number, and mailing address (cannot be a post office box) are listed in the Educational Entity Master (EEM) (www.michigan.gov/eem).

ACT uses the information in the EEM to call and send emails to the Workkeys Test Coordinators, and to ship test materials to the appropriate locations. Inaccurate information will result in critical information not being received in a timely manner, resulting in key deadlines being overlooked and delays in the receipt of test materials.

If the information in the EEM for your building/school is inaccurate, contact your authorized district EEM user to update it no later than **Friday, September 8, 2023**, to ensure your school receives the necessary information to start the Manage Participation process in November.
