Reminder: Online Testing Waiver Window Closes November 22, 2023

All Michigan schools are expected to administer the Spring 2024 M-STEP, MI-Access Functional Independence (FI), SAT with Essay, PSAT 8/9, PSAT 10, and WIDA ACCESS for ELLs assessments online.

If your school cannot administer one or more of these assessments online, you must request an online waiver through the <u>OEAA Secure Site</u> (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, November 22, 2023.

Note: As the College Board Suite of SAT Assessments is moving to digital testing, **online waiver requests for the CB assessments are new for Spring 2024**.

Pre-ID for Winter 2023 Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessment (K-2)

Pre-identification of students for the Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessment (grades K-2) opened in the <u>OEAA Secure Site</u> (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) on November 13.

Students who took the Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessment in Fall 2023 will automatically be pre-identified to the Winter 2023 Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessment by the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA).

If students tested in Fall 2023 and will not be testing in Winter 2024, no action is needed from schools, even if students are automatically pre-identified by OEAA.

Schools that choose to participate in the Winter 2024 assessment must pre-identify additional students for testing directly on the OEAA Secure Site using any of the following methods:

- MSDS Copy Function (https://bit.ly/49tbAeW)
- Pre-ID File Upload (https://bit.ly/40BpOGw)
- <u>Student Search</u> one student a time (https://bit.ly/49EiOwH)

Schools will no longer use the OEAA Secure Site to put students in online test sessions. Once students have been transferred to the Data Recognition Corporation (DRC) INSIGHT Portal starting on December 8, 2023, schools will put students into online sessions in the INSIGHT Portal.

Schools will have access to the DRC INSIGHT Portal to manage student data and test sessions starting **December 8, 2023**. Students newly pre-identified on the OEAA Secure Site will be transferred to the DRC INSIGHT Portal three times a day through **February 1, 2023**.

Pre-ID for Winter 2024 M-STEP Online Passage-based Writing Field Test, Grades 3-8

Schools that will participate in the M-STEP Online Winter 2024 Passage-based Writing Field Test (grades 3-8) can start to pre-identify participating students on the <u>Office of Educational Assessment</u> and Accountability OEAA Secure Site (www.michigan. gov/oeaa-secure). Since this field test is optional, the OEAA will not pre-identify any students to participate in it. Schools will be responsible for pre-identifying all participating students directly on the OEAA Secure Site using any of the following methods:

- Pre-ID File Upload (https://bit.ly/3SHIRNI)
- <u>Student Search</u> one student at a time (https://bit.ly/4698mKQ)

Students will no longer be put into online test sessions on the OEAA Secure Site. Schools will have access to manage student data and create online test sessions in the Data Recognition Corporation DRC INSIGHT Portal starting **December 8, 2023**. Students newly pre-identified on the OEAA Secure Site will be transferred to the DRC INSIGHT Portal three times a day through **February 8, 2024**. Should English Learners with Disabilities Take the WIDA ACCESS for ELLs or the WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs?

The Individualized Education Program (IEP) team of a student with disabilities who is also an English learner (EL) makes the decision about which summative assessment the student should take – either the WIDA ACCESS for ELLs or the WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs.

When making this decision, the IEP team can follow the <u>WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs Selection</u> <u>Guidance</u> (https://bit.ly/3FWNwnc).

The Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) does not make this decision for educators. Also, OEAA does not pre-identify (pre-ID) students to take the WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs if a student has taken the assessment previously.

Educators should note that not all students with disabilities who are also ELs should take the WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs. This assessment is specifically designed for ELs who have or function as if they have a significant cognitive disability.

If the IEP team makes the decision that the WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs is the most appropriate assessment for the student, then educators will need to update the student's Pre-ID record when the **Pre-ID window opens in the OEAA Secure Site on December 13, 2023**. Educators will have until December 28 to update records for these students if they wish to receive appropriate WIDA materials on January 30, 2024.

WIDA Pre-ID of Students and Initial Material Order

The Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) will pre-identify English Learner (EL) students for the WIDA ACCESS for ELLs Spring 2023 assessment in the <u>OEAA Secure Site</u> (www. michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) on **December 13, 2023**.

This is a one-time pull from the Michigan Student Data System (MSDS), to pre-identify students who will be taking the WIDA ACCESS for ELLs. After December 13, districts and schools are responsible for preidentifying any additional students for this assessment.

For this pull, the OEAA will use the Fall 2023 MSDS General Collection (fall student count day) and Student Record Maintenance (SRM) files that contain K-12 students identified as active English learners submitted in the MSDS through **5:00 p.m., December 4, 2023**.

Schools are urged to work with their authorized district MSDS user to ensure that the MSDS is updated by December 4. The updated information will include enrolled K-12 students who have been identified in an MSDS collection as being in an English learner (EL) program. Educators are advised to be aware of dates that may impact their ability to submit SRM files.

The Pre-ID Student Report will be available to schools on December 13, 2023, in the OEAA Secure Site. Instructions for accessing the Pre-ID Student Report and steps for pre-identifying students can be found on the <u>Secure Site Training</u> (www.michigan.gov/ securesitetraining) web page.

It is the responsibility of the district and/or school to do the following in the OEAA Secure Site:

- Unassign students who have exited the school from the WIDA ACCESS test cycle
- Pre-identify EL students not on the Pre-ID Student Report who might be newly identified as ELs or are newly enrolled in the school
- Identify students who will need to take the paper/ pencil test and change their mode of testing from online to paper/pencil
- Identify students who should take the Alternate ACCESS for ELLs and assign them to Tier T to indicate the WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs (Note: Beginning this year, Tier T can be selected for kindergarten students.)
 - The Tier T identification can be done for a group of students in the Mass Update Assessments page on the OEAA Secure Site.
 - » To learn more about how to identify students for the Alternate form of the WIDA ACCESS assessment, review the <u>Alternate ACCESS for</u> <u>ELLs Selection Guidance</u> (https://bit.ly/3FWNwnc).

Important notes:

- A student identified by the OEAA for the WIDA ACCESS for ELLs has been identified as an EL student by their current school or another school in the MSDS and was not exited from EL services.
 - The student will be expected to test. Unassigning a student from the assessment does not remove the student from the expectation to test or from accountability calculations as an EL student. If you have questions about a student being EL, contact your district MSDS person for assistance.

- » A student who exits the district is to be unassigned from testing and exited from the district in the Spring 2024 MSDS general collection.
- » If a student was submitted incorrectly in MSDS as EL — that is, if they never were an EL student — the district can submit a False EL request on the WIDA Test Exception page of the OEAA Secure Site, from December 13, 2023, through January 19, 2024. Directions for submitting a False EL request can be found on the Secure Site Training web page (www.michigan.gov/securesitetraining).
- All EL students will be pre-identified for online testing unless the school has an approved online waiver for WIDA ACCESS for ELLs. Some materials are only available as paper/ pencil testing, based on grade and domain. These materials will be ordered automatically for schools and districts based on the number of students pre-identified by 5:00 p.m., December 28, 2023.
 - » Online schools that have some students who will be taking the paper/pencil test must change the student's record from online to paper/pencil. Directions on how to change the mode (online, paper/pencil) of testing for students are found on the Secure Site Training (www.michigan.gov/securesitetraining) web page under Mass Update Assessments.
 - » If a student's mode of testing is changed to paper/pencil testing, the tier will default to Tier B. This can be changed in the student's demographic screen, accessed through the Student Search function.

- All students in schools that are administering the paper/pencil test (having received an approved online waiver) will be defaulted to Tier B. This can be changed if needed on the student's demographic screen, accessed through the Student Search function.
- All students pre-identified by the OEAA will be pre-identified to WIDA ACCESS for ELLs. Students who will be taking the WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs will have to be changed to Tier T through the student's demographic screen, accessed through the Student Search function.
- Schools will receive printed barcode labels for the student's answer document for paper/pencil tests (if pre-identified and designated as paper/ pencil) by 5:00 p.m., December 28, 2023.

WIDA ACCESS for ELLs Paper/Pencil Materials

For the school to receive paper/pencil materials for students at the beginning of the testing window, the students must be pre-identified in the OEAA Secure Site between December 13 - 28, 2023. Schools can also order WIDA ACCESS for ELLs braille and enlarged print materials directly from the Initial Material Order screen on the OEAA Secure Site during this time. All other material quantities will be based on pre-identification of students with the paper/pencil mode of testing selected.

It is important for schools to ensure their preidentification is accurate, with students taking the WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs or the paper/ pencil WIDA ACCESS for ELLs correctly identified on the OEAA Secure Site, so the school will receive the appropriate paper/pencil materials. The Initial Material Order screen must also be checked to ensure the shipping address is correct. Directions for Initial Material Orders can be found on the Secure Site Training web page (www.michigan.gov/ securesitetraining).

WIDA Test Exceptions & False English Learner (EL) Guidance

The window for WIDA Test Exceptions will be open December 13, 2023 - January 19, 2024 in the OEAA Secure Site (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure). During this window, educators may request a waiver from the Spring 2024 WIDA ACCESS for ELLs or the Alternate ACCESS for ELLs for students with specific disabilities. All test exceptions must be applied for on an annual basis and approvals do not carry over from year to year.

At this time, an exception can be requested for a student who was incorrectly identified as an English learner (EL) in the Michigan Student Data System (MSDS). This exemption request is not to be used for students who should have been exited from EL services but were not. False EL exemptions can only be submitted for a student who has never been an EL student but was incorrectly identified as such.

Accountability for Section 31a "At Risk" Report Now Available

Section 31a of Michigan's School Aid Act provides funding to eligible districts for instructional and pupil support services for students who meet the "At Risk" characteristics identified in the legislation. This funding is intended to provide instructional and direct noninstructional support services for "At Risk" eligible pupils, to help them achieve regular attendance, English language arts proficiency by the end of grade 3, mathematics proficiency by grade 8, and career and college readiness by the end of grade 11.

The 2022-23 At Risk results are now publicly available at <u>At Risk Student</u> (https://www. mischooldata.org/at-risk-student/) in the "K-12 Grade" section of MI School Data, under "School Accountability".

The information in the "At Risk Student" report supports efforts to reduce achievement gaps, to identify areas of challenge, and to allocate resources to support access to quality educational opportunities for all students.

Getting Started with the Early Literacy & Mathematics Benchmark Assessments

The Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark assessments are high-quality, optional interim assessments for grades K–2 that are offered three times per school year (in the fall, winter, and spring). These interim assessments are free to all Michigan students through funding provided by the State of Michigan.

Michigan users (educators) are pulled from the Office of Educational Assessment (OEAA) Secure Site (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) into the Data Recognition Corporation (DRC) INSIGHT Portal. Students who will take the Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark assessments must be pre-identified (pre-ID) within the OEAA site and will then be pulled into the DRC INSIGHT Portal. In their sites within the Portal, users will have the flexibility to create test sessions, print test tickets, and monitor student testing.

Follow these steps to get started with the Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark assessments:

- Ensure users have DRC INSIGHT Portal accounts, if necessary; DRC INSIGHT Portal accounts are generated from roles assigned in the OEAA Secure Site
 - » Complete instructions on how to get access to the DRC INSIGHT Portal can be found on the <u>Secure Site Training page</u> (www.michigan. gov/securesitetraining) under the **Security** section.
- Pre-ID participating students within the OEAA site
 - » Information on how to pre-identify students on the OEAA Secure Site can be found on the <u>Secure Site training page</u> (www.michigan.gov/ securesitetraining) under the Pre-Identification of Students section.

- Ensure student testing devices have been set up for testing by your Technology Coordinator
- Once the DRC INSIGHT Portal opens to users, create test sessions and print test tickets

(**Note:** Test tickets are to be stored in a secure location until the assessment administration.)

Getting Started with the Smarter Balanced Interim Assessments

The Smarter Balanced Interim assessments are high-quality assessments for grades 3-8 that are fully aligned to Michigan Standards and meet the requirements of <u>Michigan's Benchmark Assessment</u> <u>legislation, MCL 388.1704i</u> (https://bit.ly/3MmHuA4). These interim assessments are free to all Michigan students through funding provided by the State of Michigan.

Michigan's assessment vendor – Data Recognition Corporation (DRC) – automatically assigns Michigan users (educators) to the 2023–2024 Smarter Balanced Interim assessment administration within the DRC INSIGHT Portal. Once in their site in the Portal, users have the flexibility to add additional users, add students for testing, create test sessions, and print test tickets for the interim assessments. If there are no users listed in your site with access to the interim assessments, contact DRC to obtain necessary permissions for the current administration.

Follow these steps to get started with the Smarter Balanced Interim assessments within the DRC INSIGHT Portal:

- District/School users add other users, if applicable (If no users exist in your site, contact DRC to have them added.)
- District/School users add students under Student Management (Ensure student testing devices have been set up for testing by your Technology Coordinator.)
- Users add test sessions under Test Management
- Users score constructed responses under Educator Scoring, if applicable (Note: Educator Scoring is required for some focused Interim Assessment Blocks or IABs only)

 Users view student results under Report Delivery/View Online Results

Public Comment on Michigan's One Percent Alternate Assessment (MI-Access) Waiver

The federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) caps the percentage of students who can take an alternate assessment for statewide testing at 1.0 percent of the total students tested. ESSA also allows states that may exceed the one percent cap to apply for a one-year waiver. (Michigan's alternate assessment program is MI-Access.)

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is formally requesting such a waiver for the Spring 2024 assessment administration. The waiver approval will allow MDE and local education agencies in the state to continue to ensure appropriate assessment selection for students with disabilities, and to further reduce participation numbers for Michigan's alternate assessment to meet the one percent cap requirement. This waiver request includes continued plans to reduce the number and percentage of students who take MI-Access as allowed under ESSA.

MDE is seeking public comment on Michigan's draft request for a waiver on the one percent cap on participation in MI-Access. **The online public comment window opens Thursday, November 16, 2023, and closes at 11:59 p.m. on Saturday, December 16.**

Michigan School Index System Reports and Accountability Student Datafiles Coming Soon

Later this fall, the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) will be making Michigan School Index System reports and accountability student datafiles available for 2022-23 school year results. The Michigan School Index System is the accountability system in Michigan's federally approved consolidated state plan for the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). In this system, schools will receive an overall school index value ranging from 0-100 that indicates performance across subgroups in multiple data components. The overall school index values are used for identifying schools for state and federal supports. School Index results for the 2022-23 school year will include new identifications made for one federal school support category: Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) (https://bit.ly/3tXC9c1).

Authorized users of MI School Data (www.

mischooldata.org) will be able to preview school-level reports and download student-level accountability data files. In order to preview results, individuals will need to log into MI School Data. Information on accessing School Index reports and files on MI School Data can be found in the <u>Accountability Access and Preview</u> <u>Instructions</u> (https://bit.ly/3FQNU6D).

Informational guides and other helpful resources for upcoming 2022-23 school year accountability results will be posted at the <u>Michigan School Index</u> (www. mi.gov/mde-schoolindex) as they become available.

Schools will be notified directly once 2022-23 School Index reports and data are available for preview on MI School Data. his direct communication will include the dates of optional, informal question and answer (Q&A) sessions that will be conducted over Microsoft Teams. During the Q&As, a brief overview of the Index will be presented, followed by the opportunity for participants to ask questions or voice concerns about School Index results.

Writing Skills Field Test

Preparation for Passage-based Writing

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is looking for schools to participate in an M-STEP online Passage-based Writing Field Test **January 2 - February 9, 2024**.

Why have a stand-alone field test?

Field tests are used to check the adequacy of testing procedures and statistical characteristics of new test items by testing them in the field before they appear on an actual assessment. This test follows the same setup and security as the M-STEP. The field test helps to ensure that the items we are putting on the M-STEP are high quality. And, the more writing exposure your students receive, the more improvement you will see!

Who can participate?

Students in grades 3-8 can participate in field-testing items written by Michigan authors for Michigan's state assessments.

What is involved?

During the field test, students will read one passage, either literary or informational, from a variety of genres as prescribed by the standards. Students will then answer five multiple choice questions and respond to a writing prompt, which includes a checklist of components found in a well-written essay. They will not receive a score but will have an opportunity to prepare for the M-STEP and to use the checklist to improve their writing skills in the testing environment.

Where will it take place?

The online field test will take place in your school on computers.

When do I sign up?

Be ready to provide a reason for your request.
- 4. Most schools participating in the Spring 2024 Michigan-provided assessments will use their schools as the test location. However, if you need more space, or if (for example) your school is a virtual school, you can submit an off-site testing form. <u>Request off-site testing</u> (http://www.sat. org/offsiterequest) by Friday, March 1, 2024. The request can be assumed to be automatically approved unless otherwise communicated by College Board.
