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2022-23 School Accountability Results Now Available on MISchoolData.org



Results for the 2022-23 Michigan School Index System (www.mischooldata.org/school-index/) were made available to the public Monday, December 4, 2023, on the MI School Data website (www.mischooldata.org). The embargo for 2022-23 school accountability data was lifted with this public release.

Supporting resources for the Michigan School Index System that school districts can access are <u>available online</u> (www.mi.gov/mde-accountability) under **School Index**.

Districts that choose to share or communicate any of the information from its School Index scores must be aware that any student data files or screenshots of the School Index reports downloaded from MI School Data **by someone logged in as a secure user** are never to be shared publicly. Reports and files visible to logged-in users of the site contain unsuppressed and potentially personally identifiable information.

Reminder: 1% Alternate Assessment (MI-Access) Justification Forms Are Due December 12, 2023

Just a reminder to districts that 1% Cap District Justification Forms must be submitted online by December 12, 2023, to their Intermediate School District, through Catamaran.

WIDA Test Exceptions

Due to the newly revised WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs assessment, students with significant cognitive disabilities who may have previously received a WIDA Test Exception must take the WIDA ACCESS for ELLs or the WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs assessment.

The window for WIDA Test Exceptions is open December 13, 2023 – January 19, 2024 in the OEAA Secure Site (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure). During this window, educators may request a waiver from the Spring 2024 WIDA ACCESS for ELLs

Required WIDA Assessment Courses and Webinars Available in WIDA Secure Portal

Educators planning to administer and/or score the WIDA ACCESS for ELLs or WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs assessments must complete the appropriate Assessment Training Courses in their WIDA Secure Portal (https://wida.wisc.edu/login) account.

Some educators who have completed the trainings in previous years may be required to go through the courses again. These include those who will be administering:

- the paper/pencil form of the assessment and scoring the Speaking domain; these administrators are required to complete these screeners (as appropriate): Speaking for Grades 1-5: Scoring ACCESS Paper and WIDA Screener and/or the Speaking for Grades 6-12: Scoring ACCESS Paper and WIDA Screener
- the WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs assessment; these administrators are required to complete the Alternate ACCESS for ELLs: Administration and Scoring course

WIDA Assessment Management System Test Setup Window Opening

The Test Setup Window for WIDA ACCESS for ELLs and WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs opens on Monday, January 8, 2024, and closes Friday, March 22, 2024.

The Test Setup allows you to view students being assessed and to modify test sessions in <u>WIDA AMS</u> (https://bit.ly/41grqG7). If you are administering ACCESS for ELLs online, you must make sure your students are entered in the appropriate test sessions.

Students for whom pre-identification data was submitted by Thursday, December 28, 2023, has been automatically be placed into generic test sessions based on grade cluster and domain; these sessions will be available for review on January 8, 2024. To view the test sessions, log into WIDA AMS (https://bit.ly/41grqG7), click on **Test Management** and then click on **Manage Test Sessions**. This view, which can be filtered by a specific district or school, displays the status of the test session: Not Started, In Progress, or Completed.

Reminder for 2023-2024 online testing: With Central Office Services - Service Devices (COS-SD), the Technology Coordinator or other designated staff member is required to check and verify that the test content is downloaded and updated for the most current assessment administrations.

For the 2023-2024 school year, administrations for EWD004 - WIDA ACCESS for ELLs, EWD008 - WIDA Screener, and EWD372 - Sample Items must be checked and downloaded under Content Management for each active COS Configuration in Central Office Services.

Learn, Share, & Discover: Information and Ideas about Student Assessment at the 2024 Michigan School Testing Conference

The 2024 Michigan School Testing Conference (MSTC) will be held in-person February 13-15, 2024, at the Ann Arbor Sheraton Hotel. Participants can expect to prepare for the Spring 2024 state assessments by developing a deep understanding of the assessments and assessment practices to implement at the classroom, school, and district levels. The MSTC will include seven workshops on February 13. Three keynote presentations and 36 clinic sessions are offered during the February 14-15 conference.

Workshops, February 13

One full-day and six half-day workshops are offered on Tuesday, February 13. These workshops deal with various assessment issues that require "hands-on" experience and demand more time than available in the conference clinic sessions. Workshop registration fees vary (based on several factors), and only participants registered for the workshop will be permitted to attend. Extensive materials are provided for workshop participants. SCECH credits are available for each workshop.

The conference offers 36 clinic sessions and three keynote presentations. The conference sessions cover a wide range of assessment, teaching and learning topics. These include:

2023-24 Annual Education Report (AER) Coming Soon

Note: Report information, cover letter templates, and combined report data currently located on the Annual Education Report section at MISchoolData. org have not yet been updated to reflect the materials to be used for the 2023-24 school year AERs. MDE will be providing these materials and additional AER information when the AER is available in preview.

Michigan School Grades Reports Coming Soon

Per state law (MCL 380.1280g), the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) will make 2022-23 Michigan School Grades reports available for schools to preview on MI School Data (www.mischooldata.org) in the next few weeks.

Authorized users of MI School Data will soon be able to preview school-level Michigan School Grades reports before results are released publicly later in December. In order to preview school results, authorized individuals need to log into MI School Data. The preview window is offered as a courtesy to schools so that they are prepared to communicate to their communities about their performance when these data are made public. Appeals and requests to clean up data will not be considered at this time. Schools were offered the opportunity to correct data errors prior to this preview window.

The state law governing School Grades, MCL 380.1280g was repealed by Act 34 of 2023 and as such, the 2022-23 results will be the last report released.

Last Chance: Public Comment on Michigan's One Percent Alternate Assessment (MI-Access) Waiver

The federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) caps the percentage of students who can take an alternate assessment for statewide testing at 1.0 percent of the total students tested. ESSA also allows states that may exceed the one percent cap to apply for a one-year waiver. (Michigan's alternate assessment program is MI-Access.)

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is formally requesting such a waiver for the Spring 2024 assessment administration. The waiver approval will allow MDE and local education agencies in the state to continue to ensure appropriate assessment selection for students with disabilities, and to further reduce participation numbers for Michigan's alternate assessment to meet the one percent cap requirement. This waiver request includes continued plans to reduce the number and percentage of students who take MI-Access as allowed under ESSA.

MDE is seeking public comment on Michigan's draft request for a waiver on the one percent cap on participation in MI-Access. **The online public comment window is open through 11:59 p.m. on Saturday, December 16.**

Writing Skills Field Test

Preparation for Passage-based Writing

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is looking for schools to participate in an M-STEP online Passage-based Writing Field Test **January 2 - February 9, 2024**.

Why have a stand-alone field test?

Field tests are used to check the adequacy of testing procedures and statistical characteristics of new test items by testing them in the field before they appear on an actual assessment. This test follows the same setup and security as the M-STEP. The field test helps to ensure that the items we are putting on the M-STEP are high quality. And, the more writing exposure your students receive, the more improvement you will see!

Who can participate?

Students in grades 3-8 can participate in field-testing items written by Michigan authors for Michigan's state assessments.

What is involved?

During the field test, students will read one passage, either literary or informational, from a variety of genres as prescribed by the standards. Students will then answer five multiple choice questions and respond to a writing prompt, which includes a checklist of components found in a well-written essay. They will not receive a score but will have an opportunity to prepare for the M-STEP and to use the checklist to improve their writing skills in the testing environment.

Where will it take place?

The online field test will take place in your school on computers.

When do I sign up?

If your school will participate in the WorkKeys assessments in Spring 2024, you must select the week in which you prefer to receive test materials. Be sure to select a week your school will be in session and not during spring break.

If your school will not participate this spring, complete the **Not Testing** section to be removed from future communications for the current academic year. **Deadline:** You must submit your participation information by **Friday, December 8, 2023**. If you miss this deadline, you will receive periodic past-due reminders.
