Michigan School Grades Reports Now Available to the Public

On Monday, December 18, 2023, the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) made 2022-23 Michigan School Grades reports publicly available on MI School Data (www.mischooldata.org). The Michigan School Grades System is an accountability system that was signed into law in late 2018. In this system, schools receive an annual report that includes up to five letter grades and three ranking labels based on various school performance components. Schools do not receive an overall letter grade.

Note: The requirement in Michigan law to annually determine and publish School Grades for Michigan public schools was repealed by Act 34 of 2023. As such, School Grades reports for the 2022-23 school

year will be the last year of publication for this report.

2023-24 Annual Education Report (AER) Preview Available

Embargoed 2023-24 Annual Education Reports (AERs) have been available in preview since Friday December 15, 2023, to authorized MI School Data (www.mischooldata.org) users. To review AERs, authorized individuals will need to log into MI School Data. Once logged in, authorized users can access AERs by navigating to the "K-12 Grade" menu, selecting the "School Accountability" submenu and then clicking "Annual Education Report." The preview window will end on January 2, 2024, and AERs will be made publicly available shortly thereafter.

The AER pages on MI School Data provide cover letter templates and allow local educational agencies (LEAs) and schools to download or capture the link to their required compiled school performance data from the most recent school year (2022-23). If used as designed, AERs meet specific federal requirements of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) in addition to state requirements for annual reporting to parents and communities.

Updated report cover letters and data generated from the MI School Data AER site may be posted as early as January 2, 2024 and no later than February 15, 2024. In addition to being publicly posted, AERs must be communicated to parents and communities. An updated full set of Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) regarding AER requirements and the process to prepare, post, and communicate about the report, as

well as a presentation on 2023-23 AER Updates, are available on the MI School Data AER site.

Off-Site Request Calendar for 2023-24 School Year

Schools or districts planning to administer certain assessments at off-site locations must complete Off-Site Test Administration Requests.

The M-STEP and MI-Access online testing engine, INSIGHT, is available from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00

p.m. each school day during the published spring test administration windows. Some schools have regular instructional hours outside of these times and need access to INSIGHT at alternate times.

If your school requires alternate INSIGHT availability, the Assessment Coordinator must fill out and submit this <u>Alternate INSIGHT Request Form</u> (https://bit.ly/3v6ZwQT). This survey will be open **January 3** through March 15, 2024.

The form will also be available on the M-STEP web page (www.michigan.gov/mstep) and the Ml-Access web page (www.michigan.gov/mi-access), under the What's New and Current Assessment Administration sections.

The Alternate INSIGHT Request Form (https://bit.ly/3v6ZwQT) must be submitted by close of business on March 15, 2024. You are encouraged

to submit your request as soon as possible, to ensure that INSIGHT is available during your preferred testing times.

M-STEP Passage-based Writing Field Test Administration Guide Available Now

The M-STEP Passage-based Writing Field Test
Administration Guide (https://bit.ly/3RPEsHG) is now available on the M-STEP web page (www.michigan. gov/mstep) under the What's New and Current
Assessment Administration sections. (See p. 4 of this Spotlight for more information on the 2024 Passage-based Writing Field Test.)

The Test Administration Guide includes:

- · test administration policies
- directions that Test Administrators must read aloud and follow before students begin testing

The optional Passage-based Writing Field Test is available online only. The field test includes one passage, six stand-alone items, and one written response. It is estimated a student would need 30-45 minutes to complete the field test.

Writing Skills Field Test

Preparation for Passage-based Writing

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is looking for schools to participate in an M-STEP online Passage-based Writing Field Test **January 2 - February 9, 2024**.

Why have a stand-alone field test?

Field tests are used to check the adequacy of testing procedures and statistical characteristics of new test items by testing them in the field before they appear on an actual assessment. This test follows the same setup and security as the M-STEP. The field test helps to ensure that the items we are putting on the M-STEP are high quality. And, the more writing exposure your students receive, the more improvement you will see!

Who can participate?

Students in grades 3-8 can participate in field-testing items written by Michigan authors for Michigan's state assessments.

What is involved?

During the field test, students will read one passage, either literary or informational, from a variety of genres as prescribed by the standards. Students will then answer five multiple choice questions and respond to a writing prompt, which includes a checklist of components found in a well-written essay. They will not receive a score but will have an opportunity to prepare for the M-STEP and to use the checklist to improve their writing skills in the testing environment.

Where will it take place?

The online field test will take place in your school on computers.

When do I sign up?

Beginning November 13, 2023, go to the <u>OEAA Secure Site</u> (https://baa.state.mi.us/BAASecure/Login.aspx) to Pre-ID students for testing. College Board Newsletter

On December 12, College Board (CB) sent its December monthly newsletter in an email to district test coordinators and primary school test coordinators. The newsletter is sent to test coordinators listed in the Educational Entity Master (EEM) on the second Tuesday of every month.

REMINDERS

Attending Institute Confirmation Email and School Establishment

On December 13, 2023, schools should have received a six-digit Attending Institution (AI) code confirmation email from College Board (CB), indicating that their school is established for testing in Spring 2024. The CB uses AI codes to tie student data to the correct school.

If your school already has an AI code, it will remain the same; the email was sent to confirm your school's establishment for Spring 2024 testing. If your school is new to CB testing, your new AI code is contained in the email.

If you did not receive the AI code email, you can see your AI code and verify your participation status in the Test Center Participation Page and in the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) Secure Site (http://www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure). Directions on how to access the Test Center Participation page are on the OEAA Secure Site Training Page (www.michigan.gov/securesitetraining).

If your school's AI code or assessment participation information are still unavailable, contact College Board by phone at 866-499-6154 or by email at michiganadministratorsupport@collegeboard.org.

Request Off-Site Testing

Most schools participating in Spring 2024 testing will use their school as the test location. However, if your school needs more space, is a virtual school, or has students testing off site for any reason, the test coordinator should submit an <u>off-site testing form</u> (http://www.sat.org/offsiterequest) by **March 1, 2024**, so that College Board can provide the appropriate information for technical readiness at off-site locations. The request submission will be automatically approved, unless otherwise communicated by College Board.
