# Important Update: State Superintendent's Letter Regarding Spring Assessments

We have learned the State Superintendent's letter to parents regarding spring assessments incorrectly referred to M-STEP "social studies" as "social students." This error has been corrected, and the updated version of the State Superintendent's letter is available on the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) web page (www.michigan.gov/oeaa). Be sure the updated version of this letter is distributed or made available to parents/guardians in your district. In addition, we have provided a separate letter that includes information about MI-Access, Michigan's alternate assessment program.

## Spring Benchmark Aggregate Rules and Templates Available

The Spring 2022 Benchmark Aggregate Rules and Templates is now available on the <u>Benchmark Assessments web page</u> (www. michigan.gov/mde-benchmarkassessments). The spring aggregate layout is different from the fall version; therefore, it is important for districts to use the new layout when reporting aggregated spring 2022 benchmark results. A summary of the changes is in the **Submissions Instructions** tab.

Public Act 48 section 104a (http://legislature.mi.gov/doc.aspx?mcl-388-1704a) requires Michigan districts to submit their benchmark assessment results for NWEA, Curriculum Associates, Renaissance, and DRC within 30 days of administration of the assessments in both the fall and spring. In order for the assessment data to be compiled for the required statewide legislative reporting, districts must submit their spring benchmark data in the same manner they used for fall reporting. Districts may have their benchmark test results sent directly to the Michigan Data Hub through their assessments vendors, or they may choose to perform the aggregations themselves. Districts opting to perform the aggregations must follow the business rules and templates documented in Spring 2022 Benchmark Aggregate Rules and Templates.



## Technology Update for Technology Coordinators: Are you prepared for testing?

The Spring 2022 M-STEP and MI-Access testing windows are fast approaching, so now is the time to ensure your DRC INSIGHT implementation is complete and your testing devices are ready to go — if you are testing online with WIDA or the Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments, you are already mostly there.

If you are new to your role as a Technology Coordinator, your first step is to request access to the DRC INSIGHT Portal through the <u>OEAA Secure Site</u> (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) to access the necessary software downloads. Instructions for requesting this access are located on the <u>Secure Site Training page</u> (www.michigan. gov/securesitetraining). Request the appropriate Online Test Admin AMS & INSIGHT Portal access for each assessment you are responsible for (M-STEP, MI-Access, WIDA, and Early Literacy and Mathematics).

# What Are Reporting Codes and Research Codes, and How Can Districts and Schools Use Them?

### **Reporting Codes**

Schools and districts can use reporting codes in their assessment reporting in several ways, such as grouping students when generating reports, sorting barcode labels, creating online sessions, and developing additional purposes as determined by the district or school. The use of reporting codes and labels can be helpful in filtering reports when distributing student scores to various staff members.

District/schools can create a four-digit code for grouping students. For example, to group all of Mrs. Smith's mathematics students, the reporting entity would first decide on a four-digit number for Mrs. Smith (for example, 1234), and then put "1234" into each of her students' mathematics Reporting Code field on the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) Secure Site (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure).

A district/school that chooses to use reporting codes to filter state assessments scores by teacher or by groups may use a label for the reporting code. Alphabetic or numeric characters, or a combination of the two, may be used.

For example, a school could create the reporting code label "Joan Smith" for Reporting Code 1234, and "Advanced Mathematics" for Reporting Code AM12. The label could be a teacher's name, such as "Joan Smith", or a group name, such as "Advanced Mathematics". Each reporting code a district/ school creates must be unique. Codes are not to be duplicated, even if they are being used for different content areas and/or grade levels. The use of Reporting Codes is optional for districts/schools; they are not used by the OEAA for reporting in any way.

Reporting Codes can be entered on the OEAA Secure Site once Pre-Identification is open for the assessment and through the Answer Documents Received period, which is usually a few weeks after testing. If you want the printed barcode labels to come sorted by reporting codes for the M-STEP and MI-Access assessments, they have to be entered by the posted deadline.

Reporting codes can also be used to filter and assign students to online sessions in the OEAA Secure Site if entered prior to the Online Sessions deadline. Reporting codes and reporting code labels are entered in the OEAA Secure Site through one of three methods – the Student Assessment Details Page, Pre-ID File Upload, or Mass Update Assessments. For information on how to create reporting code labels, refer to the **Detailed instructions** on the <u>Secure Site Training</u> <u>webpage</u> (www.michigan.gov/securesitetraining), under the Pre-Identification section.

The created Reporting Code labels will display in:

- Dynamic Score Reports for M-STEP, MI-ACCESS, SAT, PSAT (grades 8,9,10), and Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmarks (K-2)
- Student Data Files for M-STEP, MI-ACCESS, Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmarks (K-2), PSAT, SAT, ACT WorkKeys, and WIDA ACCESS for ELLs 2.0

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## Research Codes

Research codes can be used by a district or school to gather any type of additional data on groups of students that might be beneficial when analyzing test results. For example, a school can group students to a research code that shows which mathematics class they were in during the previous year. Research codes are published on the downloadable Student Data Files available through the OEAA Secure Site, but they do not appear on reports.

Research codes can be assigned for each content area in which a student will be tested. There are two research codes available for each content area.

Research Codes are pre-labeled as Research Code 1 and 2 in the OEAA Secure Site. While there is no option for districts/schools to create a custom label for their research codes, they may "key" their codes as needed. For example, a school could decide to key students who had Mr. Martin for mathematics last year to "Research Code 1", by assigning that code to those students in the Secure Site. Alternatively, the school could choose to key Mr. Martin's students to "Research Code 2" in the Secure Site.

Research codes are assigned in the Secure Site using the same process used for reporting codes, as detailed above. Districts/schools can use research code fields in any manner that fits their needs. These codes appear only on the Student Data Files for the assessment; the codes are not included on reports. Research codes are not used by the OEAA or the Michigan Department of Education in any way.

## WIDA ACCESS for ELLs and WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs – End of Testing Reminders

The Michigan testing window for WIDA ACCESS for ELLs and WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs closes at the end of the day on **Friday, March 25, 2022**. The deadline for UPS pickup of all secure test materials for return to DRC (the testing vendor) is **Friday, April 4, 2022**.

Reminder: If your school does not have daily UPS pickup, you must call UPS the day before you need the pickup to schedule it. Materials returned to DRC after the deadline for UPS pickup will not be scored. The Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) recommends shipping back materials as soon as possible after the testing is completed.

## Standard Setting for Michigan's Early **Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments**

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is seeking educators to participate in a standard setting event for the Michigan Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments; the event is scheduled for May 3-5, 2022.

The Michigan Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments evaluate early learners' knowledge and skills in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics in grades K-2.

MDE has identified three specific questions to be answered when students take the benchmark assessments. These are:

- 1. Has the student's level of knowledge and skills in ELA and mathematics grown over the course of the school year?
- 2. Is the student significantly behind grade level (as specified by Michigan's Return to Learn law) and in need of intervention?

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3. Is the grade 2 student likely to meet the requirements of the state's Read by Grade Three legislation (P.A. 147-149, MCL 380.1280f) or an analogous minimum-competency level of mathematics knowledge?

To answer these questions, MDE is asking educators to participate in the standard setting event, to establish three performance levels for each K-2 benchmark assessment. By establishing three performance levels (defined quantitatively by two cut scores), MDE will be able to describe students' level of mastery of the state's content standards in a way that is easy for stakeholders to understand.

Educators who are interested in participating in the standard setting will use the online survey to indicate their interest. Note: Completion of the survey does not guarantee a seat at the event, as MDE will work to balance demographics, geographic location, and other factors among participants to ensure a fair representation of Michigan educators. Accepted participants will receive training that outlines the standard setting process, their specific task, and the materials they will be using.

# MI-Access Grade Level and Alignment Changes for Science

The MI-Access science assessment is changing in 2022. These changes in MI-Access science grade level and content alignments have been under consideration in past years and are now a reality for Spring 2022.

Starting this spring, MI-Access Functional Independence, Supported Independence, and Participation science assessments will be given in grades 5, 8, and 11 (formerly given in grades 4, 7, and 11).

This change aligns the grade levels at which both Michigan's general assessment (M-STEP) and the alternate assessment (MI-Access) are given.

All MI-Access science assessments are aligned to the alternate content expectations (essential elements) that were finalized in the spring of 2020. Each assessment measures the corresponding essential elements' level of complexity (range):

- MI Access Functional Independence = High Range
- MI Access Supported Independence = Medium Range
- MI-Access Participation = Low Range

MI-Access science is no longer aligned to the 2007 extended benchmarks.

The alternate content expectations (essential elements) can be found on the MI-Access webpage (www.michigan.gov/mi-access).

At the main MI-Access page, click the red "Michigan's alternate content expectations" link (top of the page). Then click on the "science and social studies" link and follow the individual grade level alternate content expectations links.

**Note:** Individualized Education Program (IEP) teams should consider making amendments to IEPs to reflect these changes for 2022.

## Nonstandard Administration Report (NAR) Now Available

SSD coordinators can now download the NAR from SSD Online (https://ssdonline.collegeboard.org/). Test coordinators are to receive a copy of the report as they organize testing for students with accommodations. The NAR contains information including which color test book a student should use and whether the student is eligible to test in the accommodated testing window for SAT with Essay.

**Note:** All students with approved accommodations taking the PSAT-related assessments can be scheduled in the accommodated testing window.

## **Test Material Deliveries Begin Next Week**

Preadministration materials and secure testing materials will arrive in schools next week. All materials will be addressed to the test coordinator for each assessment. Coordinators will receive numerous boxes throughout the delivery window; standard and accommodated materials will also arrive separately. For schools on spring break the week of March 21, shipments will be delivered the week of March 28, 2022.

A College Board Testing Materials Diagram has been posted to the <u>MME webpage</u> (www.michigan. gov/mme) and the <u>PSAT webpage</u> (www.michigan. gov/psat). The diagram summarizes the key items associated with the Spring 2022 testing materials.

## **Important Notes**

- Ensure that the Spring 2022 test materials arriving next week (manuals, answer sheets, test books, forms) do not get mixed with any testing materials that were used for Fall 2021 testing. It is imperative that only the materials that are sent for the Spring 2022 administration are used; if older materials are used, student scores will be invalidated.
- Schools that will be administrating both Grade 8 and Grade 9 assessments must keep the test books for each grade separate. Students in Grade 8 and Grade 9 cannot test together and must use the correct grade-specific test book, or their scores will be invalidated.
- An article in the upcoming March 24 edition of Spotlight will include information regarding test book colors (for SAT with Essay) and symbols (PSAT 10 and PSAT 8/9) for the Spring 2022 administration.
