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DRC Summer Technology Updates

Overnight on Thursday, June 30, 2022, Data Recognition Corporation (DRC) will push its annual major update to the DRC INSIGHT Online Assessment System, which includes the DRC INSIGHT client used for Michigan statewide assessments. If you do not push updates, DRC INSIGHT will update itself the first time it is opened.

Notable updates:

- For the 2022-23 academic year, DRC INSIGHT will be version 13.0 on the testing devices. Use this version if you are re-imaging your school's computers this summer.
- iPad users: iPads used for both WIDA and other Michigan state assessments (M-STEP, MI-Access, Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments) will have to enable Cross-Website Tracking. This also applies if the devices are using DRC INSIGHT for other products or programs.
- Central Office Services (COS) Service Devices will automatically update to version 6.0 overnight on June 30. This will happen between midnight and 5:00 a.m. local time, either on that night if your server is left online or the next time your server is online.
- If the COS Service Device is not left on overnight on June 30 or does not automatically update, it can also be updated manually using through the Update Version button under the Service Devices tab in the COS Configuration.
- In the past year, some districts found they had a better experience with a clean re-installation of the COS Service Device. A complete re-installation is not necessary, but it is sometimes easier to "wipe the slate clean" than to troubleshoot any difficulties you might have had with server settings that changed over the past year, the same way you might re-image a student device with thorny problems.

The <u>DRC INSIGHT Portal</u> (https://mi.drcedirect.com/) hosts the <u>Technology User Guide</u> (https://mi.drcedirect.com/Documents/Unsecure/Doc.aspx?id=ce356eb9-fc49-4577-8ec9-a2542648b721) and other documentation and presentations to walk you through installation options. If you like your current setup, there is no need to change it; if you do not like it, you have a variety of options.

K-12 Automatic English Learner (EL) Exits

Automatic English Learner (EL) exits will be processed for all kindergarten through grade 12 ELs who meet the overall proficiency level target of 4.8 on the 2022 WIDA ACCESS for ELLs or P2 for the 2022 WIDA Alternate ACCESS.

The exits will occur when the students' scores are loaded in the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) Secure Site and after the Michigan Student Data System (MSDS) End-of-Year General Collection has closed out. This typically in takes place in July.

The English Learner (EL) Exit Reporting Guidelines document (https://www.michigan.gov/-/media/Project/Websites/mde/2021/07/01/1920_EL_Exit_Reporting_Guidelines.pdf), available on the English Learner Resources web page (www.michigan.gov/mde-el), has been updated with directions on how to:

- see automatic EL exits in MSDS
- make sure automatic EL exits are entered into local student information systems (local SIS)
- submit a manual EL exit in MSDS, in the rare cases when that would be is appropriate

This information on how to see automatic EL exits and make making sure they are entered into your local SIS is new this year. Ensure it is shared with your pupil accounting staff and those who manage EL identification data.

Fall 2022 Pre-ID and Test Session Setup for Early Literacy and Mathematics **Benchmark Assessments (K-2)**

Beginning July 11, 2022, pre-identification and assigning of students to online tests sessions for the fall Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments (K-2) will be available on the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) Secure Site. Unlike other state assessments, the OEAA does not pre-identify students for the Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments it is the responsibility of the district or school to preidentify all students who will be participating.

The Michigan Department of Education's Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments (K-2) can be used to meet the benchmark assessment requirement in Michigan's Read by Grade 3 (https:// www.michigan.gov/mde/services/academic-standards/ literacy/early-literacy-read-by-grade-three-law) and the Return to Learn (https://www.michigan.gov/ mde/services/student-assessment/benchmarkassessments) laws.

The test administration window for the Fall 2022 Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments for students in kindergarten, first, and second grades is August 22 - October 28, 2022. These benchmark assessments are available online.

For the fall administration, there are several options for pre-identification:

 MSDS Copy function (https://www.michigan. gov/mde/-/media/Project/Websites/mde/OEAA/ Secure-Site-Training/MSDS Copy.pdf) in the Secure Site (http://www.michigan.gov/oeaasecure) can be used to copy student data from the Michigan Student Data System (MSDS) into the OEAA Secure Site for pre-identification.

This process does not involve your district's MSDS person. Important note: When using this function, you will need to search by the student's grade in the 2021-22 school year and place them in the appropriate grade for the 2022-23 school year. You cannot use this function for incoming kindergarten students since they will not yet be enrolled in MSDS in your school for the 2022-23 school year.

Students can be loaded to the OEAA Secure Site in either .csv (comma separated values) or .txt (text only) formatting.

You can use the Pre-ID File Format (https://baa. state.mi.us/BAASecure/pdfs/Pre-Id File Layout. pdf) document on the login page of the Secure Site.

You may need to enlist the help of your district's MSDS person for this process.

 Students can be pre-identified one student at a time using the Student Search (https://www. michigan.gov/mde/-/media/Project/Websites/ mde/Year/2020/01/29/Student Search One Student at a Time.pdf) function on the Secure Site.

This process is quick but may not be practical when pre-identifying large groups of students.

Beginning August 5, any students pre-identified in the Secure Site must be added to a test session in the DRC INSIGHT Portal. All students participating in the assessment must be pre-identified on the OEAA Secure Site to be copied into the DRC INSIGHT Portal to manage the online testing.

School Index Access Metrics: REP Reporting Reminder

The Michigan School Index System (http://www.michigan.gov/mde-schoolindex) uses information from the Registry for Educational Personnel (REP) (https://www.michigan.gov/cepi/pk-12/rep) to calculate schools' index values. Specifically, REP data is used to calculate the School Index's K-8 Access to Arts/Physical Education and K-8 Access to Librarians/Media Specialists components.

Schools and Districts should submit accurate REP information by June 30, 2022, to ensure worry-free accountability results for these measures later this fall. The Accountability Best Practices: Data Reporting Guide for Trouble-free Accountability Data, pp. 21-22, (https://www.michigan.gov/mde/-/media/Project/ Websites/mde/OEAA/Accountability/General/ Accountability-Best-Practices-Guide.pdf) details the specific fields and collections used from the REP by the School Index System.
