Applications Now Available for the 2021-22 Sending Scores Back Program for Shared Educational Entities (SEEs and S2E2s)

Applications are now available to Intermediate School Districts (ISDs), consortia, or other partnering districts that may wish to participate in the Sending Scores Back Program for school accountability reporting. Eligible schools and classroom programs provide alternative education, early/middle college education, gifted and talented education, or special education services to neighboring or consortium districts.

The Sending Scores Back Program allows non-resident student assessment results and non-resident student graduation statuses to be redirected in school accountability reporting to another school in a student's own district of residency. Note: Public school academies (PSAs) are not eligible for this program, as PSAs do not have resident district boundaries in the same way traditional districts do.

Applying for the Sending Scores Back Program will designate your school building or classroom program as a Shared Educational Entity (SEE) or Specialized Shared Educational Entity (S2E2). That status is used during submissions in the Michigan Student Data System (MSDS) to identify students to be specially processed in school accountability reporting. Students identified in these schools/ programs are attributed back to a school building identified in their resident school district for the purposes of school accountability calculations.

Shared Educational Entities (SEEs) and Shared Specialized Educational Entities (S2E2s) that have participated in the Sending Scores Back Program in prior school years will need to apply to reestablish their status as a SEE or S2E2 in the Sending Scores Back Program for 2021-2022 school accountability.

Writing Skills Field Test

Preparation for Passage-based Writing

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is looking for schools to participate in an M-STEP online Passage-based Writing Field Test **January 3–February 4, 2022**.

Why have a stand-alone field test?

Field tests are used to check the adequacy of testing procedures and statistical characteristics of new test items by testing them in the field before they appear on an actual assessment. This test follows the same setup and security as the M-STEP. The field test helps to ensure that the items we are putting on the M-STEP are high quality. And, the more writing exposure your students receive, the more improvement you will see!

Who can participate?

Students in grades 3-8 can participate in field-testing items written by Michigan authors for Michigan's state assessments.

What is involved?

During the field test, students will read one passage, either literary or informational, from a variety of genres as prescribed by the standards. Students will then answer five multiple choice questions and respond to a writing prompt, which includes a checklist of components found in a well-written essay. They will not receive a score, but will have an opportunity to prepare for the M-STEP and use the checklist to improve their writing skills in the testing environment.

Where will it take place?

The online field test will take place in your school on computers.

When do I sign up?

Healthy and Safe Testing Planning Guide for WIDA

The Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) has collaborated with testing vendors and educational staff to create the Healthy and Safe Testing Planning Guide (https://www.michigan.gov/documents/mde/Safe_Testing_Planning_Guide_716132_7.pdf).

This guide will help districts with their plans to administer the state assessments while maintaining the health and safety of staff and students.

The Healthy and Safe Testing Planning Guide is to be used in conjunction with the WIDA assessment-specific Test Administration Manuals (TAMs) and other documentation, the Assessment Integrity Guide, and state and local district/school health guidelines, to ensure a healthy and successful test administration. The OEAA's general guidance is for

districts and schools to start planning their assessment administrations as early as possible to mitigate assessment challenges.

Assessment Waiver Requested for Oxford Public Schools

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) has submitted an assessment waiver to the US Department of Education on behalf of Oxford Community Schools. By now, our country is aware of the terrible tragedy that occurred in Oxford on November 30, 2021. On behalf of the school district, MDE is requesting that Oxford Community Schools not be held to the 95 percent assessment participation requirement as stated in the Federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), and that the district not be included in Michigan's 2022 accountability calculations.

MI-Access Grade Level and Alignment Changes for Science

The MI-Access science assessment is changing in 2022. These changes in MI-Access science grade level and content alignments have been under consideration in past years and become a reality for Spring 2022.

Starting this spring, MI-Access Functional Independence, Supported Independence, and Participation science assessments will be given in grades 5, 8, and 11 (formerly given in grades 4, 7, and 11).

This change aligns the grade levels at which both Michigan's general assessment (M-STEP) and the alternate assessment (MI-Access) are given.

All MI-Access science assessments are aligned to the alternate content expectations (essential elements) that were finalized in the spring of 2020. Each assessment measures the corresponding essential elements' level of complexity (range):

- MI Access Functional Independence = High Range
- MI Access Supported Independence = Medium Range
- MI-Access Participation = Low Range

MI-Access science is no longer aligned to the 2007 extended benchmarks.

At the main MI-Access page, click the red "Michigan's alternate content expectations" link (top of the page). Then click on the "science and social studies" link and follow the individual grade level alternate content expectations links.

Note: Individualized Education Program (IEP) teams should consider making amendments to IEPs to reflect these changes for 2022.

Michigan Testing Manuals

Michigan-specific testing manuals will be available for the SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 assessments. There are three SAT manuals, one PSAT 10 manual, and one PSAT 8/9 manual. A sample set of manuals will be included in the Coordinator Planning Kit, which will be delivered to your school in the week of February 28, 2022. The full set of manuals to support the assessment administration in your school will be sent in the pre-administration shipment of materials, in mid-March.

Manual	What's Inside
SAT School Day Coordinator Manual	Used by the SAT test coordinator; gives complete instructions for preparing your school and staff for SAT with Essay testing
SAT School Day Standard Testing Manual	Used by the proctor; gives instructions for testing students who are testing without accommodations (using purple test books) and students testing with accommodations who are required to test on the primary test day in a standard testing room
SAT School Day Accommodated Testing Manual	Used by the proctor; gives instructions for testing students who are eligible to test in the accommodated testing window (using blue or green test books)
PSAT 10 Coordinator Manual	Used by PSAT 10 test coordinator and proctors for grade 10; gives complete instructions for preparing school and staff for PSAT 10 testing; includes scripts for proctors who will be testing students with or without accommodations
PSAT 8/9 Coordinator Manual	Used by PSAT 8/9 test coordinator and proctors for grades 8 and 9; gives complete instructions for preparing school and staff for PSAT 8/9 testing; includes scripts for proctors who will be testing students with or without accommodations
