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Benchmark Assessment Thank You!

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) and the Center for Educational Performance (CEPI) are giving a big shout-out to the districts that completed the Benchmark Assessment Reporting and Funding Application form. All expected districts – yes, 100 percent of you - completed the form, so **Thank You!**

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The information from the form will be used to develop and inform required legislative reporting, approve funding requests, and verify benchmark data is flowing as expected through the Michigan Data Hub. 2021-22 Annual Education Report (AER) Preview Available

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) and the Center for Educational Performance and Information (CEPI) have finalized the data and materials for schools to use in publishing the Annual Education Report (AER).

2021-22 AERs are available in preview for schools at www.MISchoolData.org. School/district users must log into MI School Data to review their reports. The preview window will end on **December 21, 2021**, and AERs will become public the same day.

Due to COVID-19, the United States Department of Education (USED) waived some of the required data elements for the 2021-22 AER. Further details can be found in the AER FAQ on MI School Data.

Request for Public Comment on Alternate Assessment Science Reporting Waiver

Michigan's alternate assessment (MI-Access) is aligned with Michigan's alternate content standards in English language arts (ELA), mathematics, science, and social studies. The alternate assessment is designed to allow students with the most significant cognitive disabilities to demonstrate their knowledge and skills.

Students with the most significant cognitive disabilities receive instruction and are assessed based on the alternate content expectations. Michigan adopted new content standards for science in 2015, and in 2020 the state extended them to new alternate content expectations for science. After the new content standards for science were adopted, the M-STEP general assessment field tested new assessments, beginning in 2017 and continuing through 2019. These field tests allowed three years of gradually expanding and developing the test content, while students began to be instructed under the new standards. Spring 2021 was the first operational assessment year for M-STEP science under the new content standards.

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is proposing that the Spring 2022 MI-Access science assessment should also be a field test, providing a full year in which the assessment itself is evaluated rather than student performance on the assessment. There would be no reporting based on these results. This would be a one-year field test, with operational assessment and normal reporting returning in Spring 2023.

MDE is seeking public input on its plan to apply for a waiver from the United States Department of Education for one year without MI-Access science reporting. Any interested party may submit comments by **5:00 p.m. on Thursday, January 6, 2022**, through an online survey: <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/8MDDS3H>.

WIDA Test Exceptions & False English Learner (EL) Guidance

The window for WIDA Test Exceptions is open December 13, 2021 – January 14, 2022 in the [OEAA Secure Site](http://www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure). During this window, educators may request a waiver from the Spring 2022 WIDA ACCESS for ELLs or the Alternate ACCESS for ELLs for students with specific disabilities. All test exceptions must be applied for on an annual basis and approvals do not carry over from year-to-year.

Note: This process is not to request waivers for students due to COVID-19 related reasons.

Pre-identification/Initial Materials for WIDA ACCESS and WIDA Alternate ACCESS

Pre-identification is now open for the Spring 2022 WIDA ACCESS and WIDA Alternate ACCESS on the OEAA Secure Site. Full details are in the [November 12, 2021 Spotlight](#).

Here are a few tips and reminders:

- Students who were pre-identified by OEAA have been identified as an English learner in the Michigan Student Data System (MSDS). If an identified student is no longer an English learner because they have tested as proficient, work with your district MSDS user to verify when/if the student was exited from the EL program or if a reentry date was entered in MSDS. However, these students will be expected to take the Spring 2022 WIDA assessment.
- If a student was never an English learner but was identified as such in error, a district-level user of the OEAA Secure Site is to submit a False EL request on the WIDA Test Exception page on the OEAA Secure Site.
- Unassigning a student from testing will NOT remove them from being an English learner, nor will it remove them from accountability calculations.
- OEAA pre-identified all students to the WIDA ACCESS. Schools will need to identify students who are taking the WIDA Alternate ACCESS by changing the tier designation to "T". This can be done in the Student Assessment Details (formerly Student Demographic) page located through the Student Search function on the Secure Site. It can also be changed using the Mass Update Assessments on the Secure Site. Educators are to make a decision about which students should take the WIDA Alternate ACCESS assessment, by using the [WIDA Alternate ACCESS Selection Guidance](#) found at www.michigan.gov/wida.
- Initial material orders will be based on the number of students pre-identified to the WIDA ACCESS. The mode of testing is paper/pencil for students identified for WIDA Alternate ACCESS (tier "T"). If enlarged print or braille materials are needed, they need to be ordered on the OEAA Secure Site on the Initial Material Order page.
- It is **important** that the Shipping Address on the Initial Material Order page is checked to ensure materials will be shipped to the correct location. The deadline for Initial material orders is **December 28, 2021**.
- For students who require a paper/pencil test instead of online, schools will need to change the test mode to paper/pencil. This can be done in the Student Assessment Details (formerly Student Demographic) page located through the Student Search function on the Secure Site. It can also be changed using the Mass Update Assessments on the OEAA Secure Site. The deadline for initial material orders is **December 28, 2021**.
- Student barcode labels will be provided for students who are pre-identified for the Spring 2022 WIDA paper/pencil assessment and identified as such for WIDA Alternate ACCESS by **December 28, 2021**. Any paper/pencil test materials that do not have a student barcode label will need to have the District/School labels (provided by the vendor) and complete student information applied to the test, along with the barcode number from the OEAA Secure Site.

Preparation for Passage-based Writing

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is looking for schools to participate in an M-STEP online Passage-based Writing Field Test, **January 3 – February 4, 2022.**

Field tests are used to check the adequacy of testing procedures and statistical characteristics of new test items by testing them in the field before they appear on an actual assessment. This test follows the same setup and security as the M-STEP. The field test helps to ensure that the items we are putting on the M-STEP are high quality.

REMINDERS

State-Allowed Accommodations and English Learner Supports Window

- Beginning in the week of January 10, 2022, Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Coordinators can submit requests for state-allowed accommodations (SAAs) and English learner time and one-half (+50% extended time) support in SSD Online.
- As of now, if your school administered Fall 2021 College Board assessments, you may be able see the option of submitting requests for English learner extended time in SSD Online. If the option is not currently available, check again in the week of January 10, 2022.

- If you already requested extended time for your English learners for the Fall 2021 testing, you do not need to re-enter those requests for Spring 2022 testing; the request is good for the academic year.
- SAAs are good for one academic year only. If a student used an SAA for Spring 2021 testing, the SSD Coordinator must either request the SAA again or request a College Board-approved accommodation for Spring 2022 testing.

SSD Online Issue

- There is a known issue in SSD Online, causing SSD Coordinators to receive a message about "Error Adding Student" when attempting to add a new student in SSD Online. This error will not occur with all students nor with all requests.
- If you receive this error message, use the Transfer/Move Request Form in SSD Online to add that student to your school's dashboard.
- SSD Coordinators will need the student's SSD number to submit the form. To locate their SSD number, students can log into their College Board account, select "Update Your Account", then scroll to the bottom of the page and follow the directions there.
- If the transfer takes longer than seven days to complete, or if further assistance is needed, contact the Michigan Educator Hotline and choose the option for SSD.
- If you have more than 10 students to transfer, send an email to ssd@info.collgeboard.org and request a bulk transfer template. It is expected that transfers will occur in 3-5 days.
