

## WIDA Alternate ACCESS Test Administrator Script Clarification

Before you administer WIDA Alternate ACCESS, we wanted to let you know that some of the Alternate ACCESS Test Administrator Scripts don't have explicit guidance on when to repeat QUESTIONS in the Writing domain or how a test administrator can use the Writing domain word lists. Below, we give you more detail on these two issues.



### Alternate ACCESS Writing Domain Question Repetition

Similar to the Speaking domain, all QUESTIONS in the Writing domain are intended to be repeated for students who approach the expectation or provide no response to a QUESTION the first time. See below for an example:

If meets, go to **MOVING ON** box.  
If approaches or no response, repeat **QUESTION 1**.  
After repeat, if approaches or no response, go to **QUESTION 2**.

Please follow the instructions in the Test Administration Manual for the administration of the Writing domain.

### Alternate ACCESS Writing Domain Word List

Some Writing domain tasks include a word list to help students construct their response. The Test Administrator Script includes instructions to point to the word list. You can then read these words to students for grade level clusters 6–8 and 9–12. This instruction is already included in the Test Administrator Script for grade level clusters K–2 and 3–5.
