Kenniss is a mastery based learning program. Upon entering the program, student skills are assessed using nationally recognized, research based materials to determine the critical math, reading, and writing goals needed to be more successful in school. Individual work plans include interactive activities, achievement targets, and skill development programs. Achievement goals are based on a comparison of the current student skills and Michigan Grade Level Content Expectations. Students study after school or on weekends in our Grosse Pointe facility which is stocked with best practices educational materials. To closely monitor learning activities, our instructor student ratio is 3 to 1 and many of our past NCLB students work 1 on 1 with staff. Students generally study 5 hours each week, dividing their time between math and language arts. Kenniss will operate off site if there is a sufficient number of students at one location.
