Monitoring Visits in 2019

This year, due to changes required by USDA, all sites (new and returning) will require First Week visits. Sponsors are required to complete all visits and forms:

- **Pre-operational visit and form** for NEW SITES and sites that have struggled in previous years or have new or inexperienced staff.
- First Week visits, Monitor Site Review, and Racial/Ethnic Data forms for ALL SITES.

There are no exceptions in monitoring rules. More information and forms are on the <u>SFSP website</u>¹⁰. The <u>USDA Handbooks</u>¹¹ give guidance and resources for administering and monitoring programs.

Cool Tools to Check Site Eligibility

There are two ways to find out if a site is eligible, school data and census data. Sites qualify if 50% or more students at the nearest school or census area receive free or reduced-price school meals. First check school data by finding the nearest school school data by finding the nearest school school data by District 16 pdf. If the site does not qualify then check census data using one of the tools available at the How to Determine Site Eligibility webpage 17. The page has the steps to follow and cool mapping tools!

SFSP Participants May be Eligible for WIC Benefits!

Help connect a potentially eligible SFSP participant to the WIC Program with the WIC Prescreening Tool!

The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) provides supplemental foods, health care referrals, and nutrition education, including breastfeeding promotion and support, to low-income pregnant, breastfeeding, and non-breastfeeding postpartum women, and to infants and children up to age five who are found to be at nutritional risk.

Both SFSP and WIC share common goals to promote positive health and nutrition status for young children and their families. The WIC Prescreening Tool assists applicants in determining whether or not they are potentially eligible to receive WIC benefits.

The submission deadline is May 1 and spplication submissions are rolling in! Thank you to all sponsors who have submitted already. Applications are reviewed and processed in the order received. We have a team of 14 analysts and consultants devoting a portion of their time to application review.
