New National School Lunch Program and Child and Adult Care Food Program Updates



National School Lunch Program Seamless Summer Option (SSO)

- SSO is part of the National School Lunch Program
- Standard SSO is meant to operate during school breaks, summer break, breaks for year-round schools
 - New waiver (#85) allows the NSLP SSO to operate when school is open during the regular school year, effective July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022
- SSO follows the NSLP/SBP meal pattern as well as other regulations under NSLP/SBP
- Meals for all students/children under NSLP SSO are reimbursed at the free rate (new waiver (#86) allows these meals to be reimbursed at the free SFSP rate for a higher reimbursement)



Comparison of meal service options

NSLP/SBP

- Breakfast (SBP)
- Lunch (NSLP)
- Afterschool Snack (NSLP area eligibility is waived this year)
- Could add CACFP At-Risk Afterschool Snack and Supper instead of NSLP Afterschool Snack (must have an approved CACFP application)

NSLP SSO

- Breakfast (SSO)
- Lunch (SSO)
- Afterschool Snack (NSLP area eligibility is waived this year)
- Could add CACFP At-Risk Afterschool Snack and Supper instead of NSLP Afterschool Snack (must have an approved CACFP application)



Comparison of meal service options (cont.)

NSLP/SBP

- Reimbursement
 - Claim students as free, reduced, paid and reimbursed based on student eligibility benefit
- Meal Pattern
 - o NSLP/SBP meal pattern
- Collecting Free/Reduced Applications – required

NSLP SSO

- Reimbursement
 - Every student is reimbursed at the SFSP free rate
- Meal Pattern
 - o NSLP/SBP meal pattern
- Collecting
 Free/Reduced Applications not required (more information to come)



Business as Usual – School Nutrition Program

- Professional Standards Continue to meet hiring standards for new FSD and annual training for staff
- Food Safety Inspections Continue to ask for 2 food safety inspections and document efforts
- NSLP Meal Pattern (although waiver is available) Continue to meet the NSLP/SBP meal pattern, including all vegetable subgroups
- USDA Foods and entitlement continue as usual
- Smart Snacks in Schools Continue to meet Smart Snack standards for all foods/beverages sold on a school campus, during the school day
- Local Wellness Policy Continue working towards LWP goals; complete the Triennial Assessment



Business as Usual - CACFP

- CACFP meal pattern requirements are still in effect
- Grain based desserts do not credit towards Grain component
- Milk
 - Whole unflavored for children age 1-2
 - o Unflavored low fat or skim ages 2 thru 5
 - Unflavored low fat or skim or skim flavored* milk for children age 6 and above
- Enrichment activity is required for at risk after school programs
 - o Enrichment waiver was not extended



Business as Usual – Point of Service (POS)

- All meals provided to students/children must be counted at POS
- Many options allowed:
 - o Electronic POS system
 - o Paper roster
 - Paper count sheet
 - o Multiple Meal Distribution count sheet
 - o Breakfast/lunch in the classroom count sheet or roster
- Count sheets specific for NSLP SSO are available and can be found on the NSLP website: NSLP Forms and Instructions



Business NOT as Usual – Farmers to Families Food Box Program

USDA is still supporting farmers, but is working to eliminate problems from last year, such as:

- **Uneven Distribution of Food:** The balance between urban and rural areas was skewed, leaving many communities without access to the program.
- •**High Prices:** A review of independent pricing ranged greatly and above food costs of other programs.
- Food Waste: Undistributed food was wasted as sites lacked proper storage and/or ability to distribute food boxes.

USDA is redirecting efforts toward existing food distribution programs. We are waiting for an announcement with final details.



USDA Nationwide Waivers (#85 - #96)



Nationwide Waiver to Allow the Seamless Summer Option through School Year 2021-2022

- Allows the NSLP SSO to operate when school is open during the regular school year, effective July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022
- May be used at any school, regardless of its location or the type of NSLP SSO site it is operating
- SFAs must elect to participate in NSLP SSO in the FY 2022 MEGS+ Application (should be open by June/July 2021)
- RCCIs can participate in NSLP SSO and a separate training will be held to detail specifics
- Meal types allowed to claim two meal types under NSLP SSO
 - o Breakfast and Lunch
 - Lunch and Snack
 - *Refer to comparison slide for meal type combinations



Nationwide Waiver to Allow Summer Food Service Program Reimbursement Rates in School Year 2021-2022

- For those SFAs opting to participate in the NSLP Seamless Summer Option for School Year 21-22, the reimbursement will be paid at the Summer Food Service Program rate.
 - All students will be claimed as free under NSLP SSO
 - We are waiting for guidance from USDA to determine if there will be one rate for all SFAs or two rates based on Urban/Vended and Rural/Self-Op (usually how rates are reimbursed for SFSP)



Nationwide Waiver to Allow Non-Congregate Meal Service for School Year 2021-2022

- Waiver applies to NSLP, SBP, and CACFP
- Allows for meals to be <u>served</u> in non-congregate settings
- Allows for meals to be <u>consumed</u> in noncongregate settings
- Allows for grab-and-go meals for students in school
 - Allows for social distancing during mealtimes when there is in- person learning
- Provides meal pick-up options for virtual/remote students
- Flexibilities allowed until it is deemed safe to have greater levels of congregation with inschool, in-person learning

Nationwide waiver of Mealtimes Requirement for School Year 2021-2022

- Traditional NSLP/SBP have mealtime requirements
 - Breakfast meals must be served in the morning hours
 - o Lunch must be served between 10am and 2pm
- This waiver allows for meals to be served anytime during the day, including multiple meal distribution for non-congregate/parent pick-up meals (breakfast and lunch may be distributed at the same time)



Nationwide Waiver to Allow Parents and Guardians to Pick Up Meals for Children for School Year 2021-2022

- This waiver applies to National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, Child and Adult Care Food Program and National School Lunch Program Seamless Summer Option
- Waiver is effective July 1, 2021 until June 30, 2022
- Local operators must maintain accountability and program integrity.
 - This includes putting in place processes to ensure that meals are distributed only to parents or guardians of eligible children, and that duplicate meals are not distributed to any child.
 - Eligible students/children are enrolled district students for NSLP/SBP or children enrolled in CACFP programs
 - All children are eligible for free meals under NSLP SSO (district students and those in the community)



Nationwide Waiver to Allow Specific School Meal Pattern Flexibility for School Year 2021-2022

- This waiver is different than previous Meal Pattern Flexibility Waivers
- MDE approval determined on a case-by-case basis
- Waivers are available for the following:
 - o Target 2 Sodium (Target 1 should still be met)
 - All whole grain-rich (Half of the grain options still need to be whole grain-rich)
 - o 1% milk (Flavored 1% milk may be served)
 - Vegetable subgroups (a fruit and a vegetable is still required for each lunch)
 - Variety of milk (not required to offer more than 1 kind of milk)
 - Age/grade groups (can use different age/grade group combinations or just one)
 - Preschool whole grain-rich (not required to serve 1 whole grain serving per day)



Waiver #90 (cont.)

Nationwide Waiver to Allow Specific School Meal Pattern Flexibility for School Year 2021-2022 (cont.)

- Additional information on the process to apply will come in the next Town Hall
- All other NSLP and SBP meal pattern rules apply, unless you are approved for this waiver, especially if students will be served by going through the cafeteria line.
- Effective October 1, 2021 until June 30, 2022
- Supply chain disruption is not included.



Nationwide Waiver to Allow Specific Meal Pattern Flexibility in the Child and Adult Care Food Program for School Year 2021-2022

- MDE approval required not a blanket waiver
- Sponsors must provide justification for waiver request(s)
- MDE approval determined on a case-by-case basis
- Approval request process coming soon
- Sponsor may request approval to:
 - Delay ounce equivalent implementation for grain component be fully implemented by October 1, 2021
 - o Waive requirement to serve only 1% unflavored milk
 - Waive requirement that at least one serving per day across all meal service is whole grain rich
- Effective July 1, 2021 June 30, 2022

All Other CACFP Meal Pattern Requirements Remain in Effect

- Michigan is participating
- Effective July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022
- NSLP and NSLP SSO
- To support safe access to nutritious meals, which may require pre-packaged or individually plated meals, the OVS requirement is waived for the 9-12 age/grade group.
- Reminder: OVS is optional for SBP for all age/grade groups



Nationwide Waiver of Eligibility in The Afterschool Programs and for Family Day Care Home Providers in SY 2021-2022

- Waives area eligibility requirements
- Allows all schools and other afterschool sites, regardless of location, to claim afterschool snacks and meals at the free rate
- Maximum meal reimbursement for NSLP Afterschool Snack:
 - o one snack
- Maximum meal reimbursement for CACFP At Risk Programs:
 - o one snack and/or
 - o one meal
- Enrichment component (virtual or in-person) required for CACFP and NSLP
- Effective: July 1, 2021-June 30, 2022



Waiver #93 cont.

Nationwide Waiver of Eligibility in The Afterschool Programs and for Family Day Care Home Providers in SY 2021-2022 (cont.)

- Allows all family day care homes, regardless of their location, to claim all meals and snacks at the Tier 1 rate
- Effective: July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022.





Nationwide Waiver of Onsite Monitoring Requirements in the School Meals Program – Revision - EXTENSION

- State Agency Onsite Monitoring waived for SY 21-22
 - Administrative Reviews will most likely still be conducted (more information coming, including Q&As from USDA)
 - All reviews would most likely be completed as offsite desk audits
- SFA Onsite Monitoring waived for SY 21-22
 - Onsite Monitoring is waived for both NSLP/SBP and NSLP SSO (this includes breakfast and lunch)
 - If operating NSLP Afterschool Snack, monitoring two times throughout the duration of the program is also waived.
 - Best Practice: Monitor/visit all sites providing meals and snacks throughout the year to ensure program quality, integrity, and successful operation.



Nationwide Waiver of Onsite Monitoring Requirements for State Agencies in CACFP-EXTENSION

- Applies to State Agency (MDE)
- Allows off site monitoring (desk audits) in CACFP for MDE.
- Waives MDE requirement conducting one sponsor review every 3 years.
- Waives MDE pre-approval visit for all new sponsors.
- Effective until 30 days after the end of the public health emergency.



Nationwide Waiver of Onsite Monitoring Requirements for Sponsors in CACFP-EXTENSION

- Applies to CACFP Sponsors.
- Waives on-site monitoring requirement.
- Sponsors encouraged to conduct remote facility reviews.
- Extends August 4, 2020 <u>Nationwide Waiver of Onsite</u>
 <u>Monitoring Requirements for Sponsors in Child and</u>
 <u>Adult Care Food Program</u> which expires
 September 30, 2021 until 30 days after the end of the public health emergency.



Best Practice: Maintain Program Integrity and Achieve Nutrition Program Priorities

CNP Sponsors are expected to:

- Meet the child nutrition program standards to the greatest extent possible
- Support access to healthy meals
- Focus on nutrition and meal quality so children can learn and grow
- Continue to update your Program Integrity Plan as changes occur and new waivers are in effect



Traditional SFSP to NSLP/SBP or NSLP SSO

- Traditional SFSP ends before the 1st day of school (in-person, remote, or hybrid)
 - The SFSP 2021 MEGS+ application must be completed and approved prior to claiming any SFSP meals
 - The SFSP application calendar should be filled out through the end of the summer program
- NSLP/SBP or NSLP SSO begins on the first day of the new school year
 - o The SNP 2022 MEGS+ application will be available in June/July 2021
 - o Applications must be approved prior to claims being made available
- Program example:
 - Sponsor participates in SFSP through August 22. School starts on August 23 so NSLP SSO begins
 - o Cannot run SFSP and NSLP SSO at the same time



Free and Reduced-Price Applications for SY 21-22

Are families required to submit F/R applications this school year?

- Participating in NSLP:
 - o Eligibility determination based on direct certification (DC) and F/R application
 - Verification required as normal
- Participating in SSO:
 - All students receive meals at no cost, so **F/R applications should not be collected!**
 - o Supplemental Nutrition Eligibility (SNE) is based on DC and Household Information Reports

The F/R application packet materials as well as the updated Household Information Report should be posted to the website in June

• Reminder: the F/R application and household information reports should be completed based on "current" income, which means income after July 1 for the 2021-2022 school year



Waiver #82 - Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)

CEP Requirement	Annual Deadline	Waiver Deadline
Data Used to Calculate ISP	April 1	Anytime between April 1, and June 30, 2021
Spring Data Posting	April 15	June 30, 2021 - Hoping to post in May
Elect CEP for SY 21-22	June 30	First day of school

- MEGS+ SNP 2022 application will be available in June/July 2021
- More guidance to come on the specifics on how to apply for CEP with end of year data



Pandemic EBT (P-EBT)

- School Year 2021-2022
- The American Rescue Plan- extended P-EBT through the duration of the pandemic
 - o Includes Summer 2021; and
 - o School Year 2021- 2022
- Look for information on the extension of P-EBT in the coming months

- SSO is part of the National School Lunch Program
- Standard SSO is meant to operate during school breaks, summer break, breaks for year-round schools
 - New waiver (#85) allows the NSLP SSO to operate when school is open during the regular school year, effective July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022
- SSO follows the NSLP/SBP meal pattern as well as other regulations under NSLP/SBP
- Meals for all students/children are reimbursed at the free rate (new waiver (#86) allows these meals to be reimbursed at the free SFSP rate for a higher reimbursement)
 - o RCCIs can participate in NSLP SSO to receive the higher reimbursement rate
- All the above slides detail specific waiver requirements, additional considerations, and possible meal service options more details will be coming through additional Town Halls, Child Nutrition (CN) News and Bulletins, as needed.
