




Fiscal Year 2025 Coordinated Application

- The 2025 Coordinated Application in NexSys is ready
 - Application includes SFSP, CACFP, and NSLP/SBP
- Release will happen in 2 waves starting with those that participated in the Summer Food Service Program last year
- First wave of the application was released Monday, March 11th
- Second wave (everyone else) available late-April, early-May
- If you are new to SFSP or plan to participate in SFSP and do not see the application, email <u>MDE-SFSP@michigan.gov</u>
- SFSP Application is due Thursday, May 9, 2024
- Applications must be completed and approved by MDE before SFSP operations can begin

Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP)

- FFVP Reminders:
 - FFVP funds should be drawn down <u>MONTHLY</u>, but not until *after* the snack is served *and* associated invoices have been paid. Please note, that <u>funds cannot be drawn down in</u> <u>advance</u>.
 - All drawdowns must be supported by documentation (i.e., invoices, timesheets) and kept for 3 years, plus the current year.
 - Only NexSys users with "'Accounting Entity Certifier' clearance can conduct drawdowns in NexSys. Funds must be entered and certified.
 - Check with your business office to make sure that they are drawing down grant funds in NexSys.



Ramadan Waivers

- Available Waivers:
 - Non-Congregate Meal Service (NSLP and SBP)
 - Meal Service Times (NSLP and SBP)
 - Offer Versus Serve (NSLP)
- Note: Available waivers <u>do not include</u> 7 CFR 210.10(a), 7 CFR 220.2 (Breakfast), and 7 CFR 220.8(a), therefore, meals must be served directly to eligible children.

Are Child Nutrition Program Sponsors required to have a Procurement Policy and Procurement Procedures?

- Michigan Legislature Section 380.1274 states that: "The board of a school district or board of directors of a public-school academy shall adopt written policies governing the procurement of supplies, materials, and equipment."
- Title 2, Code of Federal Regulations (2 CFR), Part 200, subpart D, Procurement Standards (2 CFR)

200.018(a)) requires all Child Nutrition Programs (CNP) Sponsors to develop and maintain a written code of conduct, and procurement procedures.

Supporting the **Use of Traditional** Indigenous Foods in the Child Nutrition **Programs Cooperative** Agreement

Proposals due on grants.gov by 11:59PM ET on April 8, 2024

- \$250,000-\$500,000 each will be awarded to up to four organizations
- The Lead Applicant must be led and staffed primarily by members of Federally Recognized Tribes and/or Native Hawaiians but may have partners that are not
- The program is intended to help address the following barriers to serving traditional Indigenous foods:
 - Product availability and procurement
 - High cost
 - Lack of scratch cooking capacity
 - Schools located in remote or rural areas
 - Inadequate access to transportation
 - Inadequate access to high-speed internet
 - Language barriers
 - USDA regulations that may be difficult to understand
 - Schools with lack of access to training and resources
- Proposals must support:
 - Procurement, preparation and crediting of traditional Indigenous foods
 - Culturally relevant nutrition education materials for students
 - Training and technical assistance for school nutrition professionals



Lake Michigan School Food System Innovation Hub

The Lake Michigan School Food System Innovation Hub supports people working to improve meals in schools across Illinois, Michigan, Wisconsin and Indiana — especially in areas that don't have equitable access to resources. With support from the USDA, they offer funding, training and other help to collectives of schools, school districts, organizations, farmers, producers, suppliers and distributors


Per 7 CFR 210.13, school food authorities must have: Two food safety inspections Written food safety program based on HACCP
