### School Lunch, Breakfast, and Afterschool Snack in Michigan

The National School Lunch, School Breakfast, and Afterschool Snack Programs were established to make nutritionally balanced, low cost meals, snacks, and/or milk available statewide to children through the completion of high school. These federally funded meal entitlement programs are available to public and nonprofit private schools and residential childcare institutions. This data is based on Michigan students that are enrolled in schools that participate in the School Nutrition Programs. Average Daily Participation is the statewide average number of students that ate meals daily in October.

Enrollment is not included in the SFSP meals claim. Therefore, the Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 enrollment is instead taken from the MSDS General Collection that took place in Fall 2020.
