August 15, 2024 - Child Nutrition Programs (CNP) Bulletin No. 9 - Michigan Department of Education to Request Federal Waiver for Child Nutrition Programs

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) will request a federal waiver of statutory and regulatory requirements in the Child Nutrition Programs, in accordance with federal guidance. MDE is requesting the waiver on behalf of Child Nutrition Program sponsors determined to be in good standing and operate in the State of Michigan. The waiver request is to allow sponsors to provide access to meals when there are events such as natural disasters, unscheduled major building repairs, court orders related to school safety or other issues, labor-management disputes, or similar unanticipated situations for up to 10 days that prevent normal operations, when no virtual learning is provided. If approved, MDE is requesting the waiver be in effect October 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025.
