## Child Nutrition Programs (CNP) Bulletin No. 25 - CSP Waiver - December 4, 2024

---

On December 29, 2023, FNS published the Interim Final Rule: Establishing the Summer EBT Program and Rural Non-Congregate Option in the Summer Meal Programs (88 FR 90230), which codified the Coordinated Services Plan outlined in program regulations at 7 CFR 225.3(e) and 7 CFR 292.10. To support access to nutritious meals and Summer EBT benefits in summer 2025, FNS recognizes that states may need to focus their resources on program implementation and rollout activities that enhance program capacity and integrity.

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE), as an administering agency of the Summer Electronic Benefits Transfer for Children Program (Summer EBT) and the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP), will request a federal waiver to defer the January 1, 2025, compliance date for the Coordinated Services Plan (CSP) for a period of one year.
