The Office of Nutrition Services (ONS) is excited to share that Governor Whitmer signed the State School Aid budget on July 23, 2024. It includes funding to continue free breakfasts and lunches for the upcoming school year through the Michigan School Meals Program.

The Michigan School Meals program alleviates the financial burden for Michigan's families, eliminates the negative stigma students previously felt when eating school meals by leveling the playing field, and has drastically increased participation throughout the state. ONS is thrilled for the continued opportunity for the 1.4 million Michigan Public School students to receive a healthy, nutritious school breakfast and lunch each day during the school year.
