Child Nutrition Programs (CNP) Bulletin No. 50 - FY 2026 FFVP Application Announcement - May 1, 2025

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is pleased to announce that the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP) application is now available for the 2026 Fiscal Year (FY). To access the application, you will need to have a [MiLogin for Business](#) account and access to [NexSys](#). Applications must be submitted in NexSys by 5:00 PM ET on **Wednesday, June 4, 2025**.

The FFVP grant is a competitive grant based on free and reduced-price meal eligibility. MDE uses Fall Count data from the 2024-2025 School Year (October 2024) to determine eligibility and the FY 2026 FFVP grant awards. A list of eligible schools is available on the MDE [FFVP How to Apply website](#). Please note that, due to limited funds, MDE has only been able to award this grant to schools that have an eligibility of more than 80% in the past.

During these office hours, a brief overview of the FFVP will be provided along with a tutorial on how to complete the FFVP application in NexSys. Attendees will have an opportunity to ask questions and get live support in the application. Registration is

required. After registering, registrants will receive a confirmation email containing information about joining the meeting.
