SUBJECT: Estimated Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Allocations for the IDEA, Part B, Section 611, Special Education Flowthrough, General Supervision System Grant and IDEA, Part B, Section 619, Special Education Preschool.

For your planning purposes, the linked charts below show your estimated allocations for the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Part B, Section 611, Special Education Flowthrough, General Supervision System Grant, and IDEA, Part B, Section 619, Special Education Preschool grants for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-2023. The estimated allocations are based on preliminary information received from the United States Department of Education (ED), audited Fall 2019 free lunch eligibility counts, Fall 2021-2022 public school counts, and 2021-2022 non-public enrollment counts (please refer to the attached charts for calculation methodology).

Intermediate School Districts (ISDs) will receive a formal Grant Award Notification from the State Superintendent, pending receipt of the federal grant award from the ED and final approval. Please note that your estimated amount could change based on the final grant award received from the ED.

The applications for the Flowthrough and Preschool grants are projected to be available and ready for ISDs to complete in the Next Generation Grant, Application and Cash Management (NexSys) system on August 1, 2022. The preliminary due date of the Flowthrough and Preschool grants is Friday, **September 2, 2022**. This due date is subject to change based on the availability of the applications in NexSys.

The General Supervision System Grant will be available in Catamaran and NexSys on July 1, 2022, with an extended due date from Monday, **August 1, 2022**, to Monday, **August 15, 2022** for both portions of the application (Catamaran and NexSys).

The following is important information regarding the 2022-2023 Flowthrough and Preschool grants, and the General Supervision System Grant applications:

Flowthrough and Preschool:

- Flowthrough and Preschool applications will cover the full 27 months of the grant expenditure period. All funds are expected to be budgeted and expended during this grant period.
- ISDs will enter budgeted indirect costs on the Budget Summary page and member districts will enter budgeted indirect costs on the Grant Member Budget(s) pages.
- There continues to be a requirement to attach each ISD proportionate share calculation to the Flowthrough (ages 3-21) and Preschool (ages 3-5) grant applications in NexSys. A proportionate share calculation example will be included under the Budget section in the Flowthrough and Preschool applications.
- The updated State Aid & IDEA, Part B, Section 611 Allowable Costs document will be attached to the Flowthrough grant application and the IDEA, Part B, Section 619 Allowable Costs document will be attached to the Preschool grant application in NexSys.

General Supervision System Grant:

- The purpose of the General Supervision System Grant (GSSG) is to support ISD development and implementation of a system of general supervision that will, in part, support improvement efforts and build capacity within its local districts to fulfill the responsibilities under IDEA to ensure the provision of a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) in the least restrictive environment (LRE) for all students with an Individualized Education Program (IEP).
- ISDs will complete the GSSG plan in Catamaran and submit a budget and staff's special education credentials in NexSys.
- The application in NexSys will be approved at 50 percent funding after an initial review of the budget and staff special education credentials. Upon the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) Office of Special Education's (OSE's)

acceptance of the GSSG plan in Catamaran, the MDE OSE will download the MDE Accepted 2022-2023 GSSG Application (Download) file from Catamaran and upload the file under the MDE Attachments link in NexSys on behalf of the ISDs and approve the applications at 100 percent funding.

- If the GSSG budget includes any staff, please attach the credentials of all staff being paid from this grant. **Remove any Social Security numbers** on any piece of documentation before attaching. All staff paid from this grant are required to possess a current Special Education credential recognized by the MDE. Each staff member credential should be attached to the credentials page of the GSSG application in NexSys.
