Additional Efforts to Increase the Percentage of Adults with a Post-Secondary Credential

-  **Michigan Career & Technical Institute** - The mission of the Michigan Career & Technical Institute (MCTI) is to develop customized workforce solutions for businesses and individuals with disabilities and provides an educational center for adults with disabilities in Michigan offering career assessment services that help students explore job options.

-  **Automotive Technology Program** – State of Michigan Mechanics Certification
-  **Certified Nursing Assistant Program** – State of Michigan Certification
-  **Information Technology Program** – 10 Internally Recognized IT Certifications



Additional Efforts to Increase the Percentage of Adults with a Post-Secondary Credential

-  **Michigan Reconnect Grant Program** - provides financial assistance to individuals age 25 and over seeking associate's degrees or industry-recognized certificates or credentials.
-  **Offender Success** - Prisoner Education provides academic, technical, and workplace skills training for prisoners to obtain a General Educational Development (GED) certificate or an Industry-Recognized Certification prior to leaving prison. Partnerships with post-secondary institutions allows prisoners to take college classes that can be applied toward their degree.
