Data Element #	FPAR 2.0 Field Name	Element Definition	Response Definition
1*	Facility Identifier	Code that identifies a hospital/clinic. The facility ID may be a true identifier (e.g. Facility NPI) or a pseudo-identifier.	
2*	Attending Physician Identifier (NPI)	A unique 10-digit identification number issued to health care providers in the United States by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).	
3	Provider role	The role of the clinical provider (e.g. doctor, registered nurse) that provided services at the encounter.	
4*	Patient Identifier	The patient identifier is a unique alphanumeric string that identifies a specific patient and is assigned by a specific organization (the assigning authority) that should be reported using [LOINC:76698-0]. In HL7 v2 messages, the patient identifier is reported in PID-3.1 and the assigning authority in PID-3.4. Examples of patient identifiers are medical record number, driver's license number and Social Security number, and their corresponding assigning authorities are the appropriate healthcare facility, state motor vehicle administration and the Social Security Administration, respectively.	
45*	Patient Status	A new patient is one who has not received any professional services from the provider within the past three years.	
46*	Postal Zip Code	Zip code where patient legally resided at time of visit	
5*	Visit Date	Visit Date	Date of clinic visit (must be <=current date)
6*	Birth Date	Birth Date	
7*	Sex at birth	In LOINC, sex refers to the biological sex of an organism, which is most commonly determined based on anatomy and physiology or genetic (chromosome) analysis. Our definition is based on the World Health Organization's definition of sex and gender: sex (male, female) refers to biological and physiological characteristics, and gender (masculine, feminine) refers to socially constructed roles, behaviors, activities, and attributes. 42	Sexual Orientation	This term was created for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) 2015 Edition Health Information Technology (Health IT) Certification Criteria final rule. An individual's physical and/or emotional attraction to another individual of the same gender, opposite gender, or both genders. 43	Gender Identity	This term was created for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) 2015 Edition Health Information Technology (Health IT) Certification Criteria final rule. Gender identity is a person's internal sense of being male, female, some combination of male and female, or neither male nor female	
8	Limited English Proficiency	This concept indicates whether the patient has limited English proficiency and may require care delivery in a language other than the English.	
9	Ethnicity OMB	"Ethnicity" as defined by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB)	Hispanic or Latino/a: A person of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race. Not Hispanic or Latino/a: A person NOT of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

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10	Race	"Race" as defined by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB)	<p>Asian: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.</p> <p>American Indian or Alaska Native: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America), and who maintains tribal affiliation or community attachment</p> <p>Black or African American: A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.</p> <p>Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific islands</p> <p>Caucasian/White: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.</p>
11	Annual Household Income	Combined family income for year before taxes. Family is a 1 person, or 2 or more persons living together as a household. (Non-negative integer)	
12	Household Size	Number in household; family is a 1 person or 2 or more persons living together as a household including patient. (Positive integer)	
13	Insurance Coverage Type	A high level description of a patient's health coverage type, including various categories of insurance (public, private, etc.) and self-pay. To report the specific source(s) of payment for a health care product or service	
14	Payer for Visit	Entity or person by whom a bill should be paid to	
15	Pregnancy Status	Pregnancy status at time of encounter	
16	Pregnancy Intention	Intention/desire in the next year to either become pregnant or prevent a pregnancy. This includes male patients seeking pregnancy with a female partner.	
17	Contraceptive Method at intake-reported at intake	At intake of patient encounter, their reported contraceptive method(s) used in the last sexual encounter.	
18	Reason for no contraceptive method use reported-at intake	At intake of patient encounter, the reason the patient reported no contraceptive method used.	
19	Contraceptive Method at exit-reported at exit	The contraceptive method(s) provided to or in use by the patient at the end of their visit after counseling and assessment by provider.	
20	Reason for no contraceptive method use reported-at exit	The reported reason at the end of the patient's visit for not using a contraceptive method(s).	
21	How contraceptive method was provided	The method for how the birth control was provided (e.g., on site, referral, prescription) to the patient at the end of an encounter	
22	Contraceptive counseling was provided	An interaction in which provider spends time (5-10 minutes) during an encounter discussing the patients choice of contraceptive method and available options.	
23	Counseling to achieve pregnancy was provided	An interaction in which a provider spends time (5-10 minutes) during an encounter discussing any services and/or provides counseling related to achieving pregnancy or addressing infertility	
41	Do you want to talk about contraception or pregnancy prevention during your visit today?		
44*	Was the patients visit to the clinic requested to be kept confidential?	Did the client request their visit to be marked as confidential typically so their health insurance is not billed to suppress the Explanation of Benefits (EOB)? Include confidential Medicaid visits.	<p>Yes includes visits that were marked confidential because the client requested their health insurance not be billed to avoid the visit appearing on an explanation of benefits (EOB) and visits that were marked confidential because Medicaid (straight or expansion) was billed since the visit is suppressed from the EOB.</p> <p>No includes all visits not marked confidential for health insurance, billing, and/or explanation of benefits purposes.</p>
24	Systolic blood pressure	Systolic blood pressure reading in mmHg (positive integer)	Systolic number
25	Diastolic blood pressure	Diastolic blood pressure reading in mmHg (positive integer)	Diastolic number
26	Body Height	Body Height in inches (positive number, 1 decimal)	
27	Body Weight	Body Weight in pounds (positive number, 1 decimal)	

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28	Tobacco Smoking Status	Clients smoking behavior	Tobacco smoking status represents a person's smoking behavior. Smoking statuses can be classified as current every day smoker, current some day smoker, former smoker, never smoker, smoker - current status unknown, unknown if ever smoked, current heavy tobacco smoker, and current light tobacco smoker. These statuses represent CDC's preferred (sometimes required) responses for recording smoking status.
29	Pap test ordered/performed at this visit	A pap test was ordered/performed during the visit	
30	Pap smear tests-FPAR 2.0 set (Panel)	Set of lab terms that may be used to gather Pap smear test results at time of the patient encounter as specified by the Family Planning Annual Report (FPAR).	
31	HPV test ordered/performed at this visit	An HPV test was ordered/performed during the visit	
32	HPV tests-FPAR 2.0 set (Panel)	Set of lab terms that may be used to gather HPV test results at time of the patient encounter as specified by the Family Planning Annual Report (FPAR).	
33	Chlamydia sp test ordered/performed at this visit	A Chlamydia test was ordered/performed during the visit	
34	Chlamydia sp tests-FPAR 2.0 set (Panel)	Set of lab terms that may be used to gather Chlamydia trachomatis test results at time of the patient encounter as specified by the Family Planning Annual Report (FPAR).	
35	Neisseria gonorrhoeae test ordered/performed at this visit	A Neisseria gonorrhoeae test was ordered/performed at the visit	
36	Neisseria gonorrhoeae tests-FPAR 2.0 set (Panel)	Set of lab terms that may be used to gather Neisseria gonorrhoeae test results at time of the patient encounter as specified by the Family Planning Annual Report (FPAR)	
37	HIV test ordered/performed at this visit	An HIV test was ordered/performed at the visit	
38	HIV 1 and 2 tests-FPAR 2.0 set (Panel)	Set of lab terms that may be used to gather HIV 1 & 2 test results at time of the patient encounter as specified by the Family Planning Annual Report (FPAR).	
39	Syphilis test ordered/performed at this visit	A Syphilis test was ordered/performed at this visit	
40	Syphilis Test Result	Set of lab terms that may be used to gather Syphilis test results at time of the patient encounter as specified by the Family Planning Annual Report (FPAR).
