

Perinatal Hepatitis B Prevention Program (PHBPP) Services

Universal Hepatitis B Vaccination Program for Newborns:

MDHHS makes hepatitis B (hepB) vaccine available for all babies born in MI. The hepB vaccine is available for the first dose (birth dose) regardless of eligibility/insurance status. A birthing facility must enroll in the program to receive the free hepB vaccine. There is no charge to the enrolled provider or parents of the newborn for the hepB vaccine administered at birth. The hepB vaccine given at birth will provide a “safety net” to prevent both horizontal and vertical hepatitis B virus (HBV) transmission.

HepB vaccine and testing:

Infants, household, and sexual contacts enrolled in the PHBPP are eligible for hepB vaccine and hepatitis B testing.

HepB vaccine can be ordered through the LHD.

HepB test kits can be ordered through the PHBPP and are available for:

- Pregnant persons who do not have insurance or Medicaid, for the initial prenatal work-up test and for repeat testing if high-risk.
- Infants born to hepatitis B surface antigen (HBsAg)-positive persons after completion of the hepB vaccine series.
- Household and sexual contacts of **HBsAg**-positive pregnant persons.
- **Safely surrendered babies** (born to pregnant persons with unknown HBsAg or HBsAg-positive results) reported to the PHBPP.

Educational information, support and tracking are provided to ensure hepB vaccine series completion and post-vaccination serologic testing is completed. These services are available for all infants, all **safely surrendered babies**, household and sexual contacts associated with pregnant HBsAg-positive persons reported to the PHBPP.
