Dear Tribal Chair and Health Director:

RE: Lead in Water Removal of Galvanized Plumbing and Blood Lead Reference Value Change State Plan Amendment (SPA) Request

This letter, in compliance with Section 1902(a)(73) and Section 2107(e)(1)(C) of the Social Security Act, serves as notice to all Tribal Chairs and Health Directors of the intent by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to submit a SPA request to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

The purpose of this SPA is to establish protocol within the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) lead abatement Health Services Initiative to include the following:

Lead in Water Removal of Galvanized Plumbing

Remove any galvanized plumbing components identified between a lead in water exceedance and the faucet. Galvanized plumbing can be a continued source of lead exposure, even when the lead plumbing components are removed. This will allow for better protection of all residents.

Blood Lead Reference Value (BLRV) Change

Current language in the CHIP-SPA states, "Medicaid or CHIP-eligible beneficiaries that have a blood lead level ≥ 5 ug/dL in non-target areas will also be eligible for abatement activities."

To align with the pending change to the BLRV, the SPA language will be revised to state, "Medicaid or CHIP-eligible beneficiaries that have a blood lead level ≥ 3.5 ug/dL in non-target areas will also be eligible for abatement activities."

These changes are expected to allow for better protection of all residents, including Native American beneficiaries. The anticipated effective date of this SPA is May 1, 2022.

There is no public hearing scheduled for this SPA. Input regarding this SPA is highly encouraged, and comments regarding this notice of intent may be submitted to Lorna Elliott-Egan, MDHHS Liaison to the Michigan tribes. In addition, MDHHS is offering to set up group or individual consultation meetings to discuss the SPA, according to the tribes' preference. Consultation meetings allow tribes the opportunity to address any concerns and voice any suggestions, revisions, or objections to be relayed to the author of the proposal.
