Dear Tribal Chair and Health Director:

RE: Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) request for comment on Behavioral Health Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) for Heightened Scrutiny (HS) settings within the ten Prepaid Inpatient Health Plan (PIHP) Regions

This letter, in compliance with Section 1902(a)(73) and Section 2107(e)(1)(C) of the Social Security Act, serves as notice to all Tribal Chairs and Health Directors of the intent by MDHHS to submit a request for public comment on Behavioral Health HCBS for HS settings within the ten PIHP regions.

In 2014, CMS released a rule for HCBS waivers called the HCBS Final Rule. This rule requires that all settings that provide HCBS-funded services meet specific criteria in order to continue to receive that funding. The final date for all settings to be HCBS-compliant is March 17, 2023.

MDHHS is responsible to ensure every setting providing HCBS services meets the requirements of the rule. In order to assess the compliance of a setting, each setting was surveyed to provide information related to the physical location of the setting as well as how the setting supports the rights and freedoms of individuals who receive HCBS-funded services.

Based upon a setting's response to the surveys, a compliance status was identified. The possible statuses for a setting were compliant, out of compliance, and requires HS.

MDHHS is now providing an opportunity for all interested parties to review the evidence provided and share their perspective for those settings that fall under heightened scrutiny for NorthCare, Northern Michigan Regional Entity, Lakeshore Regional Entity, Southwest Michigan Behavioral Health, Community Mental Health Partnership of Southeast Michigan, Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network, Oakland Community Health Network, Macomb County Community Mental Health Authority, Region 10, and Midstate Health Network. This is called the public comment period. The webpage to

review public comment information and the list of Heightened Scrutiny settings for these regions can be found at MDHHS - Home and Community-Based Services Program Transition (michigan.gov).

There is no public hearing scheduled for the for HS public comment. Input regarding HS is highly encouraged, and comments regarding this notice of intent may be submitted to Lorna Elliott-Egan, MDHHS Liaison to the Michigan tribes. Lorna can be reached at 517-512-4146, or via email at Elliott-EganL@michigan.gov. Please provide all input by October 3, 2022.

In addition, MDHHS is offering to set up group or individual consultation meetings to discuss HS, according to the tribes' preference. Consultation meetings allow tribes the opportunity to address any concerns and voice any suggestions, revisions, or objections to be relayed to the author of the proposal.
