Dear Tribal Chair and Health Director:

RE: Temporary Rate Increases for Incontinence Volume Purchase Contract

This letter, in compliance with Section 1902(a)(73) and Section 2107(e)(1)(C) of the Social Security Act, serves as notice to all Tribal Chairs and Health Directors of the intent by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to submit a Disaster State Plan Amendment (SPA) request to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

Consistently expanding global marketplace costs impacting paper/plastic incontinence products during the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency have impacted the Volume Purchase Contractor's ability to secure these products at current contractual rates. To defray these costs and avoid potential access to product issues, MDHHS intends to temporarily increase the contracted incontinence rates. The projected rate increases will be sufficient to defray impact of global marketplace costs yet continue to offer rates below that of non-contracted incontinence suppliers. These temporary rate changes are not expected to have an impact on Native American beneficiaries, tribal health clinics and urban Indian organizations. The anticipated effective date of this SPA is May 1, 2022.

There is no public hearing scheduled for this disaster relief SPA. Input regarding this amendment is highly encouraged, and comments regarding this notice of intent may be submitted to Lorna Elliott-Egan, MDHHS liaison to the Michigan tribes. In addition, MDHHS is offering to set up group or individual consultation meetings to discuss the SPA, according to the tribes' preference. Consultation meetings allow tribes the opportunity to address any concerns and voice any suggestions, revisions, or objections to be relayed to the author of the proposal. 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MDHHS appreciates the continued opportunity to work collaboratively with you to care for the residents of our state.
