Dear Tribal Chair and Health Director:

RE: Notice of Intent to Submit a State Plan Amendment (SPA) request to Update Behavioral Health Treatment and Personal Care Services Direct Care Wage Increase

This letter, in compliance with Section 1902(a)(73) and Section 2107(e)(1)(C) of the Social Security Act, serves as notice to all Tribal Chairs and Health Directors of the intent by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to submit a State Plan Amendment (SPA) request to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

The purpose of the SPA is to update the Medicaid State Plan to increase the payment paid to personal care services providers employed by Medicaid beneficiaries, self-employed providers of personal care services, supportive employment services, and behavioral health treatment behavior technician services for in-person care by \$0.85 per hour.

This amount supplements the previously approved \$2.35 per hour increase bringing the total wage increase to \$3.20 per hour for personal care services providers employed by Medicaid beneficiaries, self-employed providers of personal care services, supportive employment services, and behavioral health treatment behavior technician services for in-person care. The payment for agency providers of these services will be \$3.60 per hour and includes any associated share of employer Federal Insurance Contributions Act (FICA) payroll taxes.

The anticipated effective date for the Direct Care Worker rate increase SPA is October 1, 2023. MDHHS expects this payment continuation to increase access to services for Native American beneficiaries

There is no public hearing scheduled for this SPA. Due to the requirements within state law, specifically Section 1644 of Public Act 119 of 2023, for an effective date of October 1, 2023, it is not possible to adhere to the sixty (60) days notification. Therefore, notification is being provided as soon as possible. Input regarding this amendment is highly encouraged, and comments regarding this notice of intent may be submitted to Lorna Elliott-Egan, MDHHS Liaison to the Michigan tribes. In addition, MDHHS is offering to set up group or individual consultation meetings to discuss the SPA, according to the tribes' preference. Consultation meetings allow tribes the opportunity to address any concerns and voice any suggestions, revisions, or objections to be relayed to the author of the proposal.
