Dear Tribal Chair and Health Director:

RE: Section 1115 Waiver Extension Request to Assist in Addressing Health Impacts from Potential Lead Exposure in Flint, Michigan

This letter, in compliance with Section 1902(a)(73) and Section 2107(e)(1)(C) of the Social Security Act, serves as notice to all Tribal Chairs and Health Directors of the intent by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to submit a Section 1115 waiver extension request to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to extend the Flint Michigan Section 1115 Demonstration (Project Number 11-W-00302/5) for a period of 5 years pursuant to section 1115(a) of the Social Security Act

Pending approval from CMS, MDHHS plans to:

- Maintain expanded Medicaid eligibility for children up to age 21 and pregnant woman who:
 - Were served by the Flint water system between April 1, 2014, and September 30, 2025, AND
 - Have household incomes up to 400 percent of the federal poverty level (FPL); individuals up to age 21 and pregnant women with household income above 400 percent FPL can buy in to unsubsidized coverage under the program.
- Maintain cost-sharing and premium exemptions for eligible individuals.
- Continue the established targeted case management services for children up to age 21 and pregnant women as described above.

The waiver extension will take effect on or after October 1, 2026.

MDHHS anticipates this change will have a positive effect on Native American beneficiaries.

Input regarding this waiver extension is highly encouraged, and comments regarding this notice of intent may be submitted to Lorna Elliott-Egan, MDHHS Liaison to the Michigan tribes. In addition, MDHHS is offering to set up group or individual consultation meetings to discuss the waiver extension, according to the tribe's preference. Consultation meetings allow tribes the opportunity to address any concerns and voice any suggestions, revisions, or objections to be relayed to the author of the proposal.
